Be a 4-H All-Star

All-Star is the highest rank that a 4-H member can achieve at the County level. The All-Star award affords 4-H members the opportunity to further develop their leadership skills on a countywide basis. Each year Los Angeles County selects several 4-H members who have applied and are deserving of this rank to become All-Stars. The Los Angeles County 4-H Program expects its All-Stars to contribute to the 4-H Program during the next program year.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Any 4-H member is eligible to apply for the All-Star award who:

- 1. Is 15 years of age as of January 1 of the year of application (2006);
- 2. Has completed two years of 4-H Club work;
- 3. Has Gold Star Rank and/or demonstrated leadership skills and qualities;
- 4. Shows strong interest in continuing in the 4-H Youth Development Program and has specific ideas regarding ways in which he/she can give guidance and leadership to some phase of the 4-H Program;
- 5. Has actively participated beyond the 4-H club level.

Emerald Star Project

If a member has earned Gold Star Rank or will be 16 years old by January 1, 2006, they can consider doing an advanced leadership project and earn an Emerald Star for their hat. An Emerald Star Project can be started at any time during the year. Do you have an idea for an activity you could plan and run to benefit the county 4-H program or your community?

Call the 4-H office for a packet of information on the Emerald Star Program. Each 4-H district has an Emerald Star advisor. You can work with the Advisor from any of the districts.

Hints for New 4-H Members

The following are some suggestions for new members to help you get the most out of your 4-H experience.

- ❖ Attend all your club and project meetings, if possible. If you must miss meetings for health and/or family emergency reasons, be sure to let your leader know before the meeting and make arrangements for make-up, if necessary. That's part of learning to be a responsible person.

2006-2007 California 4-H State Ambassador Application Due March 31, 2006

The California 4-H State Ambassador Program is a working honor that provides 4-H members expanded opportunities to serve the California 4-H Youth Development Program. 4-H State Ambassador is one of the highest service opportunities and recognition attainable in the California 4-H Youth Development Program. 4-H State Ambassadors and 4-H State Ambassador Advisors will be selected in order to:

- Support the Mission and Direction of the University of California 4-H YD Program
- Support various local, sectional and statewide programs and activities; including public presentations, leadership development opportunities and community service
- Assist in the introduction of innovative programming through a Service Project
- Provide leadership in the development of the 4-H State Leadership Conference
- Recognize and reward outstanding accomplishments within the area of leadership

4-H State Ambassador are youth who have excelled in the areas of leadership and community service, and have been selected to serve the California State 4-H Youth Development Program in roles that promote leadership through education and service. 4-H State Ambassador Advisors are adult volunteers who are experienced in working with older youth in the areas of leadership and community service.

Term:

4-H State Ambassadors are expected to make a 14-month commitment to the program beginning at the Orientation, July 7-9, 2006 and ending August 31, 2007. 4-H State Ambassadors may only serve one term.

Eligibility Requirements:

Youth: 4-H State Ambassador candidates must have completed at least one

year as a California 4-H Youth Development Program member, and be at least 16 years of age as of January 1, 2006, yet no older than 18

as of December 31, 2006.

Adult: 4-H State Ambassador Advisor candidates must be a 4-H volunteer

leader with at least one year of experience in facilitating and challenging teens in the duties associated with being a 4-H State Ambassador. Adult advisors must be at least 21 years of age.

Preference will be given to those not related to any current 4-H State

Ambassador youth candidate.
