The California 4-H Youth Development Program is committed to promoting higher education. Statewide scholarships are designed for graduating high school and collegiate-age 4-H members to help fund educational expenses such as tuition, books, room and board, and other educational expenses.

Application Process

Applications must be postmarked by April 30, 2007 and sent to the California State 4-H Office. All required information must be included to be for consideration. The California State 4-H Office will notify recipients by June 1, 2007.

Applicants may apply for multiple scholarships, but are only eligible to receive one scholarship per year. Previous scholarship recipients may reapply. Submit only one application cover page total and separate personal essays for each scholarship. All applicants are evaluated on how well the applicant meets the stated criteria.

Applications must contain the following to be considered:

- □ Application Cover Page (with County Cooperative Extension 4-H Staff signature)
- □ Personal Essay for each scholarship
- □ **Proof of enrollment** (enrollment verification) from the applicant's high school (if high school senior) or vocational school or college (if high school graduate).
- ☐ For those applying for the ASFMRA Agricultural Scholarship, a certified copy of the applicant's academic transcripts must be included.

Selected candidates will need to provide his/her Social Security Number to the State 4-H Office and thank-you notes to the donor before a check will be issued. Any candidate with a disability preventing him or her from completing the application in the usual method should contact the California State 4-H Office for assistance.

Available Scholarships

Dean Memorial Legacy Scholarship

<u>Award:</u> Three, \$1,000 scholarships are available <u>Eligibility:</u>

- Applicants must be high school seniors or high school graduates between the ages of 16 and 25 (as of April 30), who were in the California 4-H Youth Development Program at the time of their high school graduation.
- Applications will be judged on leadership and citizenship experiences and how 4-H has shaped the candidate's future goals
- > Applications will be judged on demonstrated level of skill and knowledge in any project area.
- Awards shall be given to students pursuing any field of scholastic endeavor at accredited colleges or universities in the United States. Applicants must be full-time students as defined by the applicant's institution.

Mabel W. Jacks Scholarship

Award: Five, \$700 scholarships are available

Eligibility:

- Applicants must be high school seniors or high school graduates, between the ages of 16 to 25 (as of April 30), currently residing in California or Nevada, who were enrolled in the California and/or Nevada 4-H Youth Development Program at the time of their high school graduation.
- Applications will be judged on leadership and citizenship experiences and how 4-H has shaped the candidate's future goals
- Consideration will be given to those students pursuing higher education who, in the absence of a scholarship, might otherwise be unable to attend a college or university (financial need). All applicants who have been active members of the 4-H Youth Development Program will be considered regardless of their financial ability.
- Awards shall be given to students pursuing any field of scholastic endeavor at accredited colleges or universities in the United States. Applicants must be full-time students as defined by the applicant's institution.

American Society of Farm Managers and Rural Appraisers (ASFMRA) Agricultural Scholarship

The California Chapter of American Society of Farm Managers and Rural Appraisers, a statewide professional organization of farm managers and rural appraisers, is sponsoring these scholarships to provide financial support to 4-H youth pursuing a degree and career in higher education in the field of rural appraising, agricultural education, agricultural management or agricultural financial services. Award: Two, \$1,000 scholarships to attend a four-year university in California

One, \$250 scholarship to attend a two-year community college in California

Eligibility:

- Applicants must be high school seniors or high school graduates, between the ages of 16 to 25 (as of April 30), currently residing in California or Nevada, who were enrolled in the California and/or Nevada 4-H Youth Development Program at the time of their high school graduation.
- All applicants must have a 3.0 grade point average or higher. The application for this scholarship shall be accompanied by a certified copy of the applicant's transcripts which will reflect a 3.0 or higher GPA in core/academic subjects, based upon a standard 4.0 scale.
- Applications will be judged on leadership and citizenship experiences, agriculture related 4-H project work and future plans in agriculture.
- Awards shall be given to students pursuing a degree in rural appraisal, agricultural education, agricultural management or agricultural financial services. Applicants must be full-time students as defined by the applicant's institution.

Expectations of Scholarship Recipients:

- > Scholarship winners will be strongly encouraged to attend a banquet at either the fall (October) or spring (April) ASFMRA conference where they will be recognized before members. Reasonable costs will be covered by ASFMRA to help the recipient attend the banquet. If the costs are prohibitive, other arrangements will be made to best represent the winners to ASFMRA members.
- Applicant's essays may be used by ASFMRA for promotional and marketing purposes.

Samarin Family Vocational Education Scholarship

Award: One, \$1,000 scholarship is available

Eligibility:

- Applicants must be high school seniors or high school graduates between the ages of 16 and 25 (as of April 30), who were in the California 4-H Youth Development Program at the time of their high school graduation.
- Applicants must be enrolled in, or intending to enroll in (upon high school graduation), a vocational/trade school or Junior College vocational training program. Vocational education is defined as "Organized educational programs which are directly related to the preparation of individuals for paid or unpaid employment, or for additional preparation for a career requiring other than a baccalaureate or advanced degree." Examples include drafting, dental assistant, medical assistant, pharmacy technician, and other vocational fields.
- Consideration will be given first to those students who, in the absence of a scholarship, might otherwise be unable to attend a vocational/trade school or junior college vocational training program. All applicants in need of encouragement and support in pursuing a vocational program will be considered regardless of financial ability.
- Applications will be judged on how 4-H has shaped the candidate's future goals, financial need, and how the scholarship will help the candidate reach his/her vocational education goals.
