


All-Star is the highest rank that a 4-H member can achieve at the County level. The All-Star award affords 4-H members the opportunity to further develop their leadership skills on a countywide basis. Emerald Star Project

The Emerald Star program is an expanded Leadership opportunity. If a member has earned a Gold Star Rank or will be 16 by January 1, 2008, they can consider doing an advanced leadership project and earn an Emerald Star for their hat. What activity could they plan and run to benefit the county 4-H program or their community? An Emerald Star Project can be started at any time during the year. Call the 4-H office for a packet of information on the Emerald Star Program. Each 4-H district has an Emerald Star advisor. You can work with the Advisor from any of the districts.

Examples of successful Emerald Star projects include 4-H being in an entry for the Rose Parade, organizing a community effort to "fix up" a women's shelter, setting up the Entry by Video option for county field day. Can you think of something that you would like added to the LA County 4-H program? Consider working on setting up these types of activities as an Emerald Star project.

- 2. Individuals must be enrolled in the Project Area that they are presenting. In a Team Presentation, both members must be enrolled in the project. Individual and Group Determined Projects must be registered and approved by the County Office.
- 3. Divisions: Juniors are 4th & 5th grades. Intermediates are 6th, 7th, and 8th grades. Seniors are 9th grade and above. In the case of a team presentation the oldest member determines the Division in which the presentation is judged. No primary members will be judged in this area.
- 4. Time Limits: Juniors and Intermediates should be 5- 12 minutes. Seniors should be 7- 12 minutes.
- 5. Members may compete in only 1 presentation but may also compete in Public Speaking, Extemporaneous Speaking, Impromptu, and Share the Fun Activities. Separate entry forms and preregistration are required for each.
- 6. Presenter(s) must provide all equipment and supplies, including easels for their presentation.

SOUTHERN SECTIONAL 4-H FIELD DAY

LOCATION:

Mt. San Antonio College (Mt. SAC). 100 North Grand Avenue, Walnut, CA. Take the San Bernardino Freeway (Interstate 10) toward West Covina, Exit on Grand Avenue (south) and follow Grand Avenue to Mt. SAC (Entrance A).

Alternate Route: State Highway 60 to State Highway 57 (north), exit on Temple Avenue (West) and follow signs to entrance.

PARKING:

Free parking is available. Do not park in handicapped spaces, as citations will be issued.

FOOD:

The Southern Sectional Teen Council sponsors a Food Booth with profits going into the Southern Section Teen Council account to defray program expenses. Breakfast and Lunch, drinks and snacks will be available. Participants who prefer to bring their lunch can find ample picnic areas.

GENERAL RULES:

Southern Sectional 4-H Field Day Competition is open to all 4-H Youth members Age 9 or 4 grade to 19 years of age as of January 1 of the current 4-H year. Primary participants may not be judged, but may participate in Primary Presentation Clinic held at Southern Sectional 4-H Field Day.

There will be three competitive divisions:

- Junior 4 and 5 grades
 Intermediate 6 , 7 and 8 grades
- Senior 9th grade and above

A Team Presentation may consist of 2 or 3 members. Members of teams and group presentations will be judged using the age or grade of the oldest team member. Any team presentations that include any primary members may not be judged.

Members may participate in all activities in accordance with the rules of each contest. A participant may give a Presentation, Interpretive Reading, A Public Speech, and an Impromptu Speech. If a member enters more than one activity, it is his/her responsibility to coordinate the time of each activity. Room Supervisors and Judges will consider special request, if possible. If a member or team is not available at the designed time, they may forfeit the right to participate in that activity. This rule has been established to ensure time schedules and in fairness to all participants.

If a member qualifies to participate at the State level in more than one Presentation, he/she can only advance in one Presentation.

State News

New State 4-H Policies – effective immediately!

Several new policies for the State 4-H Policy Manual were adopted and presented in January 2008. Below is a <u>brief summary</u> of key areas on these policies. All club leaders will receive a complete copy and all 4-H members and leaders will be required to comply with the <u>complete</u> policy. If you would like a detailed copy of any of these policies, contact the 4-H office or download them from the State 4-H website: <u>www.ca4h.org</u>

Section 310.6 – <u>Volunteers on VMOs (Councils)</u>, committees, and <u>Taskforces</u> - Members of these entities must be appointed 4-H volunteers or youth members in good standing.

Section 418.1 – <u>Domestic Exchanges</u> – Approval for all exchanges must come from the County Director. Youth participants must be at least 12 years of age. The California 4-H code of conduct is in full force at all times. All adults in the hosting household must undergo an adequate background check or the exchange will not be allowed. All adults (18 & over) in hosting household within California must be fingerprint screened. At least one host youth must be a 4-H member in good standing.

Section 418.2 – <u>International Exchanges</u> – In addition to the above domestic exchange policies, approval must also be given by the State 4-H Director and youth must be at least 14 years of age.

Section 704.2 – <u>Bank Accounts</u> – All 4-H clubs & units must be chartered to use the 4-H name and logo, to raise & disperse funds in support of 4-H programs, projects and groups. The County Director must approve the establishment of checking or savings accounts. No other accounts are allowed without approval. Guidelines in the Treasurer's manual and the State 4-H Policy manual must be followed. All bank accounts must use the UCCE 4-H Office mailing address as the address of record. No UCCE or 4-H staff should be signatories on 4-H accounts. The County Director or designee must review all monthly statements. Failure to follow the policies can result in revoking of the club or unit's charter. (All banking changes must be in place no later than July 1, 2008.)

Section 818 – <u>Petting Zoos</u> – Risks involved with petting zoos must be minimized by adhering to the specific guidelines listed in this policy for health and safety.

Section 819 – <u>Search of Personal Property</u> – The UC is responsible for maintaining a safe environment during the course of all 4-H YDP events. If there is reason to perform a search of personal property, the specific guidelines listed in this policy must be followed.

State 4-H Horse Classic

The State 4-H Horse Classic will be held on April 5 & 6 at CSU Fresno. To be a contestant, participants must be enrolled in the 4-H horse project by February 5. The schedule will be: Saturday, April 5 - Hippology (a.m. & p.m.), Horse Judging (p.m.), Demonstrations & Public Speaking (evening). Sunday, April 6 - Horse Bowl (a.m. & p.m.). The educational contest rules and entry forms are on-line at: <u>http://ca4h.org/projresource/horse/</u>.
