#### • A Fair to Remember

The history of the *Monte Farmer's Fair* leads back to El Monte, California, in 1935, when **Otto H. Kruse** launched a small feed mill, *O.H. Kruse Grain & Milling*. Otto's son, **Richard**, was born at the mill location, as were his brothers and sisters. From a young age, Richard worked closely with his father Otto to make their aspiring feed mill an American success story.

In addition to working in the mill for most of his life, Richard graduated from Cal Poly San Luis Obispo and served in the U.S. Navy. In 1978, Richard opened **Kruse Feed & Supply** in the original feed mill where he was born and raised.

As the years passed, and the family business grew, in 1987 the La Habra store was opened with much excitement. What started as a small mill, has now grown into the largest livestock feed producer in California, and one of the largest in the Nation, *Western Milling*. The hard-working Kruse family is still diligently serving the public from various locations throughout the state today. Richard recently informed me of the sad news that the original El Monte location will be closing its doors in January for good, due to the lack of livestock needs in the area.

In 1957, through generosity, and an interest in 4-H and the welfare of youth, Otto and his Uncle Adolph launched the first-ever **Monte Farmer's Fair** at the mill location, where it remained until 1975. On this **51**<sup>st</sup> **Anniversary** of the **Monte Farmer's Fair**, we would like to thank the Kruse family for a historical event all North San Gabriel 4-Hers and the public can enjoy year after year.

This year, the **Monte Farmer's Fair** will be held on **January 24<sup>th</sup> from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.** at the Good Shepherd Lutheran School in Eagle Rock (6338 N. Figueroa Ave. Los Angeles, CA 90042). Entries will be accepted starting at **8:30 a.m.** 

Participants are from the North San Gabriel District. In order to participate, members need to contact their club leader for entry forms. Entries for the **Monte Farmer's Fair** can include: Home Economics, Arts & Crafts, Small Livestock, Dogs and Cats. There will be a food booth, auction, awards, and several Skill Workshops.

On Wednesday, December 3<sup>rd</sup>, a winner for the *Monte Farmer's Fair Cover Contest* was selected. Nick Christensen of Eagle Rock/Highland Park Club received this esteemed honor, and will have his artwork displayed on the Fair's fliers.

- Los Angeles County 4-H SET Los Angeles County is embarking on its 4-H Science, Engineering and Technology (SET) Initiative, a national 4-H initiative to train new scientists for the future. For 2009, our focus, working with Orange County 4-H, will be water quality, thanks to a grant from Toyota. The Los Angeles County SET Team has been recruited, and will work closely with 4-H Advisor Keith Nathaniel to roll out Set in 2009. The Los Angeles County 4-H SET Team includes 4-H Club Co-Leader and Council President Peter Michel, 4-H Project Leaders Mike Spaziano and Diana Kaljumagi, 4-H All Star Jessica Kwan, Maria Aguirre from Los Angeles Unified School District's Beyond the Bell Program, and Pat Brown, our partner at the US Air Force base. SET activities will be implemented through 4-H clubs, county wide events, and in cooperative with our afterschool and military partnerships. The SET Team will be participating in a February roll-out training. - **Judging Day** Los Angeles County Judging Day is a countywide event where 4-H'ers learn teamwork and cooperation as members of a judging team while developing their decision-making skills. Judging Day will be Saturday, February 28, 2009 at Antelope Valley High School. Additional information will be sent to your Club Leader and be available online soon.
- **Field Day & Fashion Revue** Field Day is one of the most valuable assets of our 4-H program. This is a day where 4-H'ers share the skills and knowledge they have acquired in their 4-H projects. By learning public speaking and demonstration skills, 4-H'ers prepare themselves for college and the workplace. 4-H members may observe and gain knowledge relating to many different 4-H projects. Parents and friends are encouraged to attend. If you have never been to Field Day before you will be surprised at the poise and abilities of these 4-H members.

All members of the LA County 4-H are invited to participate in LA County Field Day tentatively scheduled for March 28, 2009. 4-H Presentations are very informative and will certainly enrich individual knowledge.

Public Speaking, Impromptu Speaking and Extemporaneous Speaking are also interesting. Fashion Revue showcases our best LA County 4-H clothing projects. Share the Fun Skits, Cultural Arts Presentations, and Song Leading contests are creative and entertaining.

- 4-H members attend to participate\observe and learn\receive awards, recognizing their individual skills and knowledge. Remember it's a 4-H "Family Affair", and encourage parents and friends of 4-H to attend and support the youth. Medal winners will be eligible to go on to Sectional Field Day, which is tentatively scheduled for Saturday, May 16, 2009. Keep a look out for more Field Day information to come.
- Los Angeles County 4-H Science Fair It's not too early to start thinking about 4-H Science Fair on April 18, 2009! Science projects are a wonderful "learn by doing" opportunity. Today, with schools so focused on "teaching to the test", and with mandated language arts and math curriculum dominating the school day, science education is often neglected in school. Help make sure that kids develop their analytical thinking skills by getting them involved in hands-on science through 4-H. Many 4-H'ers are already involved in projects that can be presented as science projects. Now is a great time to plan for a project to present in April!
