Policy Highlight of the Month

Many of you may be aware that we are implementing a new volunteer enrollment system for better management, tracking and efficiency of new volunteers. Several factors were considered before implementing the new system:

- 1. Too many volunteers did not complete the full enrollment process and started working with youth at the project level before being cleared;
- 2. Unnecessary risk for the university;
- 3. A more efficient and accurate new volunteer database;
- 4. Community Club leaders were not aware of new volunteers in their club;
- 5. Better control and management of new volunteers;

In addition, we wanted to have a system that better complimented the 4-H online enrollment system and database while giving us more information about volunteers before they become enrolled.



• The Celebrated Jumping Frog of Calaveras County

When Samuel Clemens traveled from San Francisco to a mining camp between Yosemite and Lake Tahoe called "Frogtown," in the city of Angels Camp, Calaveras County, he visited a local character named Simon Wheeler. In visiting with Mr. Wheeler, the tale of a famous pet frog is revealed to him, and Samuel publishes a short story for the first time in 1865, under the name of "Mark Twain." The beloved classic The Celebrated Jumping Frog of Calaveras County (http://etext.virginia.edu/railton/project s/price/frog.htm) is actually set at a real fair that occurs each year in Calaveras County!



The Calaveras County Fair and Jumping Frog Jubilee will occur on May 19-22, 2011, at Frogtown, Angels Camp, in Calaveras County. The theme for the 2011 Fair is "Pirates of the Carrots and Beans." Dating back to the 1800s, this now world-renowned fair was indeed started by miners to celebrate formal roads finally being paved in their camp. In addition to hosting a rodeo, horse events, livestock exhibits and baked goods and preserves competitions, the fair actually has a "Frog Jump," with over 2,000 frogs competing for the "frog gold!"

You may be wondering, what is a champion frog? Frogs who are entered into the county fair and jubilee must be at least four inches from nose to tail. They must begin their jump with all four feet, including toes, on an eight-inch launch pad. The frogs have exactly one minute to jump as high as they can and may spend time in the soothing and elite "frog spa" while waiting to compete. The first 50 frogs to win the first jump move on to next round of competition at the "International Frog Jump Grand Finals," and a leaping chance at breaking the record of *Rosie The Ribeter* (current champion, winning 5,000 dollars for highest jump which was 21' 5 ¾").



Fairs, no matter what county they are in, are loads of fun. Maybe some time you might like to attend the *Calaveras County Fair and Jumping Frog Jubilee* http://www.frogtown.org/jubilee_home.shtml. Perhaps we should consider adding a 4-H "Frog Jumping Project" to our projects offered, or even just add a frog jumping competition to the San Gabriel Valley 4-H Fair or the Antelope Valley Fair. Either way, if you visit the *Calaveras County Fair and Jumping Frog Jubilee*, you are more than likely to have a "hoppy experience."

• The "Royals"

With the recent Royal Wedding in England, we are delighted to highlight our own "Royalty"... the San Gabriel Valley Fair Los Angeles County 4-H King and Queen! After a long absence, Los Angeles County 4-H is returning to a long-standing, and much cherished tradition, of crowning youth members who have demonstrated leadership, dedication, honor, and a love of both Los Angeles County 4-H and the San Gabriel Valley 4-H Fair.

The San Gabriel Valley Fair, now in its 80th year, is held at the Chino Fairgrounds with opportunities for Los Angeles County 4-H youth to compete with project work in the areas of food and nutrition, home arts and



furnishings, childcare and clothing, table settings, rabbits, cavies, poultry, small livestock, photography and graphic arts. The fair has 4-H project displays on wildlife, beekeeping, entomology, camping, rocketry, computers, electricity, ornamental horticulture, and many others. There is a 4-H Dog Show, Fashion Show, food auction, livestock contests, silent auction, barbecue and an awards ceremony.

Originally held in Pomona, and traditionally sponsored and executed by both the South San Gabriel and North San Gabriel 4-H Districts of Los Angeles County, the fair actually began with a competition for "San Gabriel Valley Los Angeles County 4-H Fair Queen" in the 1950s. The competition for 4-H Fair Queen (eventually including a competition for Los Angeles County 4-H King starting in the 1960s) was a highly sought after honor, and the competition was stiff!

Youth members had to be nominated by their 4-H district and participate in a lengthy interview conducted by a panel-- consisting of a past king and queen, a youth member who has graduated out of the 4-H program, a current fair official, and a community member outside of the realm of the 4-H program.

During both the nomination and interview processes, prospective 4-H Queens and Kings of the San Gabriel Valley 4-H Fair are evaluated on a long commitment to not only the Los Angeles County 4-H Program and their individual 4-H Clubs, but their length of service at the fair, including various categories they have worked in (i.e. small livestock, publicity, home economics), different roles and responsibilities (i.e. youth director positions), and having moved up the ranks in leadership positions to coordinate and execute this fun and well-attended fair. This is not a popularity contest. Leadership positions for the fair include youth directors in the categories of: finance, concessions, activities, creative arts, home economics, primary, vendors, publicity, small & large livestock, horses & ponies, dogs, auction, barbecue and awards to name a few. Los Angeles County 4-H youth may apply for a position on the fair committee each year, and with a lot of time, effort and teamwork, can "move up the ranks" of the fair's committee, while helping to grow and improve the fair.

Much like the idea of "Once an All Star, always an All Star," past kings and queens hold a special place in Los Angeles County 4-H history, even if their actual reign is only for the length of a year. Past San Gabriel Valley 4-H Fair Queen, Johanna Stewart of Greenleaf 4-H Club, really takes her commitment to the fair seriously-continuing to assist year after year, even after many years of having graduated out of the 4-H Program.
