4-H Policy and Information Update

Many of you may be aware that we are implementing a new volunteer enrollment system for better management, tracking and efficiency of new volunteers. Several factors were considered before implementing the new system:

- 1. Too many volunteers did not complete the full enrollment process and started working with youth at the project level before being cleared;
- 2. Unnecessary risk for the university;
- 3. A more efficient and accurate new volunteer database;
- 4. Community Club leaders were not aware of new volunteers in their club;
- 5. Better control and management of new volunteers;

In addition, we wanted to have a system that better complimented the 4-H online enrollment system and database while giving us more information about volunteers before they become enrolled.

Senior 4-H members (age 14 by Jan. 1, 2012) need to use the 2011 version of the record book forms for their 2011-2012 record books. We had been using the 2008 version of record book forms but in September the 2011 version was released. Senior members should use these new forms. The state record book competition requires the new forms for the state competition. The 2011 record book forms can be found on the state 4-H website and the LA county 4-H website. Junior and Intermediate members can use either the 2008 or the 2011 forms this year for their 2011-2012 records books, but next year they will need to use the new forms for their 2012-2013 records. The on-line record keeping system prints out forms in the 2011 version.

Judges will not be accessing members records on-line. The record forms will need to be printed out and inserted into the member's official Record Book for judging. • Special Recognition at 2012 State Presentation Day

A special recognition pin will be awarded for youth who participate in State Presentation Day and focus their presentations on healthy living. This year's focus area is healthy food. Potential topics may include USDA's MyPlate, serving sizes, sugar-sweetened beverages, nutrition facts labels, food groups, nutrients, and more. • Weight of the Nation (Free HBO Series)

The Weight of the Nation, a four-part documentary aired on Home Box Office (HBO) and is to be available for viewing free of charge on <u>HBO's site (www.hbo.com/theweightofthenation</u>). Another 12 short films about specific topics, such as the stigma society places on people struggling with obesity, workplace wellness, and more, will be available via the above site.

The Weight of the Nation documentary is a springboard for an extensive, long-term public health campaign designed to raise national awareness and engage communities. The films contain critical and useful information we can apply to our own lives and share with our families, members, and communities. The documentary films dramatize the issues and challenges identified in the Institute of Medicine's (IOM) recent evidence-based report, <u>Accelerating Progress in Obesity Prevention</u>. The IOM report identifies key prevention strategies to address the nation's obesity epidemic, which draw upon the work Kaiser Permanente has been doing.

The Weight of the Nation films include case studies; uplifting personal stories of people, families, and community members who are tackling weight issues; and interviews with our nation's leading experts.

- **Episode 1 Consequences:** Examines the scope of the obesity epidemic and explores the serious health consequences of being overweight or obese.
- **Episode 2 Choices:** Shares scientific insights into how to lose weight and explores what needs to change in people's lives, including where they work, eat, learn and play, while spotlighting individuals who are waging the battle successfully.
- **Episode 3 Children in Crisis:** Tells the heart-wrenching stories of young people struggling with excess weight and facing serious medical complications at an early age, and examines how marketing shapes food choices.
- **Episode 4 Challenges:** Examines the driving forces behind the obesity epidemic, including agriculture, economics, evolutionary biology, racial and socioeconomic disparities, and physical inactivity.

Please see the films and talk about the issues with your family, your colleagues in the workplace, and your neighbors. See what you can do and how you can get involved.

• Online Course on Bullying Prevention Available

The National Center for School Engagement, in collaboration with the Partnership for Families and Children, has released the online course, "<u>Getting Serious: A Best Practice Approach to Bullying Prevention</u>."
