It's time to get ready for the first***FREE*** public education class of the year, presented by the UCCE Master Food Preservers of El Dorado County. The first class, **Of Course You Can! Food Safety and Basic Water Bath Canning**, begins with a crash course in food safety and moves along to explanations and demonstrations of basic canning, a preservation method which requires only a few inexpensive tools to master. There will also be a presentation on the safe use of steam canners.

Among the many methods of home food preservation, water and steam canning allow for safe, easy preservation of high acid foods. Fruits, jams and jellies, sauerkraut and pickles may be canned, as well as most tomato products and fruit butters and marmalades.

The Master Food Preservers offer ***FREE*** classes in safe home food preserving on Tuesdays and Saturdays throughout the harvest season, starting Tuesday, July 7, 2015 through October. Classes begin at 10:00 a.m. and end at approximately noon. All of the public education classes are free to the public, and a good time will be had by all. The instructors volunteer to teach because they genuinely enjoy preserving food and sharing their knowledge with others. Each class includes lecture, demonstrations of the techniques with plenty of time for questions and answers.
