POLICY

4-H Policy and Information Update

For the last several years, the 4-H program has been at the forefront of increasing science literacy skills for youth, particularly youth who participate in 4-H. The University of California 4-H Youth Development Program's SET initiative (Science, Engineering and Technology) has been integrated into lots of projects, events and other program experiences. One of the ways that youth demonstrate and apply their skills is through fairs, symposia, skill-a-thons and field days. This year, during the 4-H Pet and Science Symposium youth will have a chance to participate in a rocket launch competition. The county office will supply a Rescue Rocket kit to clubs interested in participating in the competition, which will follow the 4-H National Youth Science Day. There will be a distance competition, an accuracy competition and a competition to see which rocket goes the farthest.

From the National Science Experiment

"The 4-H National Youth Science Day brings together thousands of youth, volunteers and educators from the nation's 109 land-grant colleges and universities to simultaneously complete the National Science Experiment. The 2014 National Science Experiment, Rockets to the Rescue, provides young scientists the opportunity to explore how aerospace engineering can be used to solve real world challenges – such as food distribution in emergency situations – to make a positive impact in our world. Rockets to the Rescue captures many of the wonders and issues of modern day engineering. It emphasizes aerospace engineering, as it incorporates lessons related to math, science and physics. While it is a fictional scenario, it has real life parallels."

What is Macy 4-H? The Macy 4-H stands for "Head, Heart, Hands, and Health." Macy 4-H Club has been at Macy Intermediate for one academic school year. In its first year, Macy 4-H had three branches: Macy 4-H GreenSpace, Macy 4-H Leadership Project and the Macy 4-H Film Crew. In these groups, 4-H members accomplished many achievements such as winning medals in the Judging Day Competition and Field Day Competitions.

Macy 4-H went to its first competition on February 22, 2014. This competition took place at Mt. San Antonio College. Judging Day is when 4-H members from all over the county come together to judge different livestock. Other categories that students participated in were Plant Science, Mechanical Science, and Creative Arts. Even though it was our first year competing, two of our Macy 4-H members won medals. The two members were Mitchell Saisho and Kaylin Kwan. Mitchell Saisho won gold in Natural Science, blue in Small Livestock, and blue in Leisure Education. Kaylin Kwan won silver in Clothing and Textiles. Placing in the competition was a great achievement because two of our members won a total of four medals.

On March 22, 2014, our Macy 4-H Club went to their second competition which was Field Day. We carpooled to Mt. San Antonio College with Mr. Lopez (4-H Community Leader) and Mrs. Lopez (4-H Booster Club President). Field Day is a speech competition where 4-H members speak on a certain topic in front of judges. The students who attended this competition were: Esmeralda Aceituno, Enrique Morales, Victoria Morales, Kaylin Kwan, Nicole Kwan, Xavier Cruz, and Owen Lazaro. In that competition, Esmeralda won gold in Mock Interview, Xavier earned gold in Public Speaking and Impromptu. He also won blue in Presentations. Kaylin and Nicole Kwan earned gold in Educational Display, Enrique Morales placed blue in Public Speaking, Victoria Morales placed blue in Prepared Reading, and Owen Lazaro got blue in Public Speaking.

Xavier Cruz, Victoria Morales, Enrique Morales, Nicole Kwan, Amalia Jimenez, Jayce Gomez, Esmeralda Aceituno, and Kaylin Kwan all participated in the Sectionals Field Day on May 17, 2014. All the students arrived at Mt. San Antonio College with Mr. Lopez, the 4-H leader, and Ms. Margie Lopez. Students participated in this competition because it was an excellent way for them to practice their public speaking. Many kids get anxious speaking in public so being part of this event helped students face their fear. In Sectionals Field Day, everyone was required to present or speak in front of a panel of judges. The judges would then rank them within their categories. Xavier Cruz struck gold in the State Format Impromptu, Amalia Jimenez took blue in Mock Interview, and Victoria Morales won gold in Mock Interview. Enrique Morales earned gold in State Format Impromptu. Nicole and Kaylin Kwan won gold in Educational Display.

On May 31, 2014, the State Field Day took place at the University of California Davis. Some of the participants on this Field Day were Xavier Cruz, Victoria Morales, Enrique Morales, Nicole Kwan, and Kaylin Kwan. The Macy 4-H group traveled north to Davis with Mrs. Lopez, the 4-H Booster Club President, and Mr. and Mrs. Lopez. On the day of the competition, everyone in Macy 4-H placed. In Mock Interview, Nicole Kwan and Victoria Morales earned gold. Xavier Cruz and Enrique Morales took home blue in Presentation, and Nicole and Kaylin Kwan won blue in Educational Display. In Entomology, Enrique Morales got red and Xavier Cruz won green. In a judging contest, Nicole Kwan and Enrique Morales took blue while Xavier Cruz and Kaylin Kwan won gold.

4-H is a youth organization whose goal is for children to grow as responsible citizens, develop leadership skills, and gain important life skills. Macy 4-H is encouraging their members to reach their goals by participating in Judging Day and in the various Field Days. This year, Macy 4-H is planning to attend Judging Day and Field Day for its second year in a row. We also plan to sell produce grown in the Macy garden at the Farmer's Market. The Farmer's Market is held by the Environmental Garden Club in Bell Gardens. Next month, some Macy 4-H members will be participating at the Pet Symposium at Belvedere Park. All these events will help prepare our members for the future. 4-H's motto is "To Make the Best Better" and Macy 4-H plans to do just that!

• CANYON COYOTES GOES TO THE DOGS

At the October 6 general meeting of the Canyon Coyotes 4-H, dog leader Mrs. Jacobsen, and two project members gave demonstrations on what is involved with showing your dog at the AV Fair.

Megan Kitcko and her dog, Samson, Therese Benz and Allie, and Mrs. Jacobsen and Kaia, a white Gernan Shepherd, demonstrated things that the members work on preparing for fair. There are four classes in which members can participate at fair: showmanship, obedience, tricks and costume. Last year's fair theme was Poultry in Motion so Therese dressed her dog as a peacock and Megan dressed her dog as a chicken.

In showmanship you are asked questions about dog anatomy, your dog's breed and general informational questions about dogs. In showmanship the class is lined up largest to smallest and you walk your dog. In obedience, they are looking to see how well your dog listens to your commands. Two of the commands are the "sit/stay" and "down/stay". Based on how long you have been in the project (sub-novice, novice, etc.) determines whether or not your dog is on or off leash. In the down/stay the dogs have to lay for three minutes without getting up. Everything is very quiet and Mrs. Jacobsen said that can seem like the longest three minutes of your life.

Dogs in the project must like other dogs and people. Since this is a year-round project, it gives you a special bonding time with your dog. The fair is going to try to add an agility class this year, which will give the dogs some fun play time as well.

State Record Book competition is focused on selecting senior 4-H members who have demonstrated outstanding achievement in their 4-H project work. Books are judged against standard criteria. Those books displaying the most outstanding 4-H work, goal management skills, and leadership and citizenship development are selected as state medalists and/or state winners. To be eligible for 2014 State Competition, senior members must have completed the California 4-H Quick Start Record Book Course between January 1, 2014 and October 1, 2014. Seniors intending to submit their records this year are asked to notify Noel Keller by Oct. 15, 2014. Seniors need to turn in their records for the state competition and recognition to the LA County 4-H office by Oct. 20, 2014. State record book judging will occur November 7-9. The Emerald Star Program is designed for intermediate and Senior 4-H members. In general, the Emerald Star project's purpose includes:

- o Providing an opportunity for 4-H members to develop projects in their community or in 4-H beyond the club level
- o Improving, creating, and expanding 4-H programs
- Helping individual 4-H members grow and improve in the areas of organization, leadership, and project planning

This program is designed to help youth learn about project planning, organization, and presentation. Typically, youth develop an action plan for some type of multi-county event. They then organize and facilitate this event. After completion and presentation of their project, they are awarded with the Emerald Star ranking
