4-H Policy and Information Update June 2015

The end of the 4-H program year is near (June 30) and I'm sure each of you has greatly impacted and enhanced the lives of the 4-H youth in your club. You have been a mentor, a leader, a teacher, a facilitator, a coach, and a friend to 4-Hers throughout the year. How can we harness the work you've done with them this year and translate it into the public having a better understanding of the work of 4-H? One way, is to have 4-H youth complete a record book. The record book documents in detail the value the program is having on the lives of 4-Hers and shows how impactful the experience has been. I encourage each of you to ask your 4-H members to consider doing a record book and capture their 4-H experience during this program year. I want to compile the information from the completed record books into a document that can be shown to county supervisors, state legislators and University of California representatives to demonstrate the value of the 4-H program.

It is my hope that the information I glean from the record books along with other evidence will continue to strengthen the perception and value of 4-H. The University of California, like other public institutions, continues to face the fiscal pressures of budgetary constraints, so the more we can document our worth, the better position 4-H looks.

Sectional Field Day Macy 4-H Communications Committee


Sectionals Field Day is a speech competition where 4-H members can participate in different types of presentations. Some of the categories are the following: Interpretative Reading, Prepared Speech, Mock Interview, Educational Display and Impromptu Speech. The rules at this competition are more strict than those at the County Field Day. For example, members are not allowed to participate if they are not in uniform. The 4-H uniform consists of white pants, a white dress shirt, a 4-H tie or kerchief, and a 4-H hat. The judges listen to the speeches and score the contestants. After all the speeches in that category are presented, the judges discuss amongst themselves and decide where the participant will be placed. Awards are given based on appearance, delivery of the speech, and the clarity of the content.

On May 16, 2015, Macy 4-H participated in the Sectionals Field Day at Mt. San Antonio College. The people who will be advancing to the State Field Day because they won gold are Evan Lam (Prepared Speech), Jayce Gomez (Team Educational Display), Nicole Kwan (Team Educational Display), Xavier Cruz (Demonstration and Illustrated Talk), Isabella Mendez (Individual Educational Display), Victoria Morales (Mock Interview, Interpretative Reading, and Team Educational Display), and Kaylin Kwan (Interpretative Reading, Team Educational Display, and Mock Interview). State Field Day will be held on Saturday, May 30, 2015, at U.C. Davis. The money raised throughout the year will help cover the expenses of the trip.

Whitney, down the Grand Canyon, on river rafting, backpacking the John Muir Trail, and on cross country skiing trips. Dee served on numerous committees and positions for 4-H at the District level, and is currently South San Gabriel District President. She is on the Incentives and Records Committee for Los Angeles County, Sectional Representative for Los Angeles County since 2002, Director for Los Angeles County 4-H Summer Camp for 24 years, and Vice President of L.A. County Leaders Council. Next year she will be President of the LA County Council and Shooting Sports Chair. If seniors think that they might want to submit their 4-H records this year to the State Record Book competition, you should do the following.

- 1) look at the guidelines and requirements for the state record book competition on the state website
- 2) submit the Intent to Submit form to the county 4-H office or Noel Keller (nkeller91711@gmail.com) by June 30th indicating your intent to submit a record book to the state record book competition (the intent form is available on the state 4-H website) AND
- 3) complete the online California 4-H Quick Start Record Book Course on the state 4-H website by June 30, 2015 (even if you completed it last year)
- 4) be ready to turn in their record book to the county 4-H office by Oc.t 19th, 2015
- 5) contact a member of the county I&R committee if you have any questions.

If later you decide to not submit your records, then notify Noel Keller to cancel.

Record Book Manual 2011-2014 and Forms Noel Keller, LA County Incentives and Recognition Committee Chair

Record Book Manual 2011-2014 is the only record manual and forms that should be used this year, with the exception of two new forms that are being piloted - a past years summary form and a leadership development report form for multiple leadership experiences, which can optionally be used. The Record Book Manual is available on the state 4-H website and on our county website. The online record book system uses the forms from this 2011-2014 manual. If you have questions contact a member of the county I&R Committee or Noel Keller (nkeller91711@gmail.com).

Record Book Pilot Forms – Leadership Development Report and Past Years Summary State I&R Advisory Committee

The State I & R advisory committee has been working to streamline some of the forms and content of the Record Book Manual in preparation for revisions to the 2015-16 edition, which will launch July 1, 2015. They have released two forms as pilots that may be used this year, 2014-15, if members choose to. The Leadership Development Report (LDR) is an alternate of the Junior/Teen Leadership Development Report (JTLDR) and can is especially helpful for members who have multiple leadership roles in their club, county, section and state involvement. They have also provided an example of the Summary Pages that are used for State Competition to document previous years' experiences. For 2014-15, this is only an example and members may choose to use the template provided or complete the Summary pages as they wish according to the guidelines in the Record Book Manual. Evaluators (judges) at club, county and state competitions should accept, treat and score these new forms in the same way as they would the current forms. Both forms may be found as separate items on the State website.

CLUB OFFICERS, CAMP COUNSELORS – Junior and Teen Leadership Development Report (JTLDR) Noel Keller, LA County Incentives and Recognition Committee Chair

The Junior and Teen Leadership Development Report should be filled out by Junior and Teen Leaders in your club. It should also be filled out by your Club Officers and Leadership Project members. The form is also to be used by county All Stars, State Ambassadors, Camp Counselors and Exchange program participants. At the top of the form, you indicate for which leadership position the form is being completed. A member might actually fill out several of these forms during the planning at the start of the 4-H year. At the end of the year, remember to complete the forms and include them in your record book.

Instead of completing multiple JTLDR forms, you can now complete the new pilot Leadership Development Report (LDR) form where you can combine all your leadership experience on one form.

• County Project Recognition for MEMBERS Noel Keller, LA County Incentives and Recognition Committee Chair

Senior 4-H members are eligible to enter the state record book competition. State competition is focused on selecting 4-H members who have demonstrated outstanding achievement in their 4-H project work. Books are judged against standard criteria. Those books displaying the most outstanding 4-H work, life skills development, and leadership and citizenship development are selected as state medalists and/or state winners.

Currently LA County 4-H judges member record books with a focus on a member-designated project area. Awards are given out in project areas. At the state record book competition, books are judged for the overall achievement of the member, without regard to just one project area. This year Seniors will again be able to select a project area for their record book evaluation at the county level. The county may be required to change the county judging to be more like the state competition for the next year (2015-16).

At this time, the county is planning to keep the county record book judging for Juniors and Intermediates the same as it has been with judging in a member-designated project area. Next year we may be required to change the county judging to be more like the state guidelines for county record evaluation. A new Record Book Manual is due out on July 1, 2015 for the next program year (2015-2016).

For the county competition the 4-H online forms will need to be printed out and submitted as hard copy. 2014-2015 record books are due September 15 to the 4-H Office or by September 16 to an Incentives and Recognition Committee member (Noel Keller, Judylynn Pelling, Carrie DeYoung, Peter Michel, Dee Keese). The LA County Awards Program will be held Saturday, October 10th after the County 4-H Pet and Science Symposium.

The evaluation of the officer records is done with the Danish system of judging so all officers have a chance to earn a Gold medal for their officer work.
