#### • Date Change for County Record Books and Officer Books Submission

You will have one more week to complete your 2014-2015 Record Book for submission to the county Record Book competition. The due date is also changed for the submission of your Officer Book. The due date for submission has been changed from September 8/9 to September 15 to the 4-H office by 4pm or September 16 by 9pm to a member of the county I&R committee (Noel Keller, Judylynn Pelling, Dee Keese and Carrie DeYoung). The due dates will be changed on the 2015 ID forms, but you may still use the 2015 ID forms with the prior due dates listed.

#### • BE SURE TO USE - <u>Record Book Manual 2011-2014</u> and Forms

Record Book Manual 2011-2014 is the record manual and forms that should be used this year. It is available on the state 4-H website and on our county website. #### • 2014-2015 County Record Book ID Form & Information

The forms and information for the 2015 LA County Record Book Competition are available on the county 4-H website under <u>APPLICATIONS</u>. The on-line recordkeeping will be the same as last year. For the county competition the 4-H forms will need to be printed out and submitted as hard copy. 2014-2015 record books are due September 15 to the 4-H Office or by September 16 to an Incentives and Recognition Committee member (Noel Keller, Judylynn Pelling, Carrie DeYoung, Dee Keese). The LA County Awards Program will be held Saturday, October 10th after the county 4-H Pet Symposium.

#### • Club Representatives for County Record Book Judging

REMINDER – If a club submits record books to the County Record Book Competition, then the club needs to provide a judge for one of the Record Book judging days, Saturday September 19 or September 26. The judging again this year will be held at Good Shepherd Lutheran School/Church (6338 N. Figueroa St., LA, 90042). Judging record books is a good way to learn about record books for your club. No experience in judging is required. There is an orientation for judging at the start of each judging day. A club can only have up to three club representatives for judging, Judges do not judge record books from their own club. Judges should plan to stay from 9am until about 5pm, with a lunch and snacks provided. Contact Noel Keller (nkeller91711@gmail.com) with the names of judges by Thursday, September 17.

# Record Book Pilot Forms – Leadership Development Report and Past Years Summary State I&R Advisory Committee

The State I & R advisory committee has been working to streamline some of the forms and content of the Record Book Manual in preparation for revisions to the 2015-16 edition, which will launch July 1, 2015. They have released two forms as pilots that may be used this year, 2014-15, if members choose to. The Leadership Development Report (LDR) is an alternate of the Junior/Teen Leadership Development Report (JTLDR) and can is especially helpful for members who have multiple leadership roles in their club, county, section and state involvement. They have also provided an example of the Summary Pages that are used for State Competition to document previous years' experiences. For 2014-15, this is only an example and members may choose to use the template provided or complete the Summary pages as they wish according to the guidelines in the Record Book Manual. Evaluators (judges) at club, county and state competitions should accept, treat and score these new forms in the same way as they would the current forms. Both forms may be found as separate items on the State website.

#### • Officer Book Gold Medal

Did you do a great job as a club officer last year? If so, be sure to submit a 2014-2015 Officer Book for the officer book recognition program. The information and forms for the 2015 Officer Book Recognition Program are on the county website under APPLICATIONS. The evaluation of the officer records is done with the Danish system of judging so all officers have a chance to earn a Gold medal for their officer work. 2014-2015 Officer books are due at the same time as 2014-2015 record books, September 15 to the 4-H Office or by September 16 to an Incentives and Recognition Committee member (Noel Keller, Judylynn Pelling, Carrie DeYoung, Dee Keese).
