Policy

4-H Policy and Information Update September 2015

Recently, some parents have inquired about the University's photo release policy. The University of California 4-H Youth Development Program has always maintained a policy where parents (and youth for that matter) can ask to have a photo removed from any UC publication and UC owned website. The University takes very seriously the privacy consideration of parents and will honor any request to have pictures of themselves or youth removed. Having said that, please keep in mind that is it practically impossible to have an opt out option for families. Here are three examples to highlight the difficulty in having one:

Scenario 1:

Camp staff take over a yearly picture of over 150 campers and that is put on the county website. Since we do not know all 200 youth we are not able to verify which youth did and which did not sign the photo release (identifying each and every youth to ensure we have a photo release, and then photo shopping the youth out whose parent's did not sign it would be extremely time consuming.

Scenario 2:

Pictures of youth are taken at presentation day and then a family sends the picture to the county office but it has some other youth in the background and we don't know the names of the youth so we can't check to see if they signed a photo release.

Scenario 3:

There are 400-500 youth at State Leadership Conference, and we have pictures being posted on our Facebook page (which is monitored by 4-H state office staff), website, and afterglow from the event - we would not be able to use any of these if we had an opt out option because we would not know the names of the youth to be able to use any of the photos. Youth are not self-identified in pictures used for these purposes.

Los Angeles Record Book Competition

The county record book competition will be run much like last year. Members should plan to submit their records on the forms from the Record Book Manual 2011-2014 or the new Record Book Manual 2011-2015. The 4-H program year ended June 30. Your current record books should contain your records up to that time.

When entering their record book, members should complete the Record Book ID form indicating their choices for project recognition and request for leadership recognition. All senior books will be evaluated for Senior Awards of Excellence in Leadership, Community Service, Achievement, S.E.T. and Healthy Living. Good record keeping is a life skill. Take the time to complete your 4-H records in a way that you will enjoy looking at in years to come. Your 4-H record book can be a reference for future college and job applications.

The completed record books should be turned into the 4-H office by 4pm on Sept. 15 or to a Incentives & Recognition Committee Member (Noel Keller, Judylynn Pelling, Dee Keese, or Carrie DeYoung) by 9pm on Sept. 16. Record book judging will occur Saturday, Sept. 19 and 26. The results of the judging will be announced at the County Awards program on Oct. 10 at Belvedere Park around 2:30pm, after the county Pet Symposium.

• BE SURE TO USE - Record Book Manual 2011-2014 and Forms

Officer Book Gold Medal

Did you do a great job as a club officer last year? If so, be sure to submit a 2014-2015 Officer Book for the officer book recognition program. The information and forms for the 2015 Officer Book Recognition Program are on the county website under APPLICATIONS. The evaluation of the officer records is done with the Danish system of judging so all officers have a chance to earn a Gold medal for their officer work. 2014-2015 Officer books are due at the same time as 2014-2015 record books, September 15 to the 4-H Office or by September 16 to an Incentives and Recognition Committee member (Noel Keller, Judylynn Pelling, Carrie DeYoung, Dee Keese).

• Club Representatives for County Record Book Judging

REMINDER – If a club submits record books to the County Record Book Competition, that club needs to provide a judge for one of the Record Book judging days, Saturday September 19 or September 26. The judging again this year will be held at Good Shepherd Lutheran School/Church (6338 N. Figueroa St., LA, 90042). Judging record books is a good way to learn about record books for your club. No experience in judging is required. There is an orientation for judging at the start of each judging day. A club can only have up to three club representatives for judging, Judges do not judge record books from their own club. Judges should plan to stay from 9am until about 5pm, with a lunch and snacks provided. Contact Noel Keller (nkeller91711@gmail.com) with the names of judges by Thursday, September 17.

• State Record Book Competition

State Record Book competition is focused on selecting senior 4-H members who have demonstrated outstanding achievement in their 4-H project work. Books are judged against standard criteria. Those books displaying the most outstanding 4-H work, goal management skills, and leadership and citizenship development are selected as state medalists and/or state winners.

Age Eligibility: Senior 4-H members (at least 14 years of age and no older than 19 years old by December 31 of the program year for which the book is being entered) are eligible to enter state competition.

Requirement to enter: To be eligible for 2015 State Competition, members must complete the <u>California 4-H Quick Start Record Book Course</u> by June 30, 2015. If you did not complete the course and did not send in your letter of intent to submit a state record book and you still would like to consider doing it, please contact Noel (nkeller91711@gmail.com) as soon as possible.

- o Providing meaningful leadership training and growth opportunities for teens;
- o Providing opportunities for volunteerism and community service:
- o Maintaining teens interest in organized youth development programs; and
- o Providing opportunities for teens to have fun!

The Junior All-Star Program will be open to any 4-H member who is or will be starting eighth grade in the fall of the program year in which he/she is selected to serve. While this is a non-competitive program, youth must complete an application form, and meet the following criteria:

- Have completed 1 year as a junior/teen leader in 4-H, or be enrolled as a junior/teen leader for the current year;
- o Involvement in a 4-H county-wide committee or significant involvement on the club level; and/or involvement in activities outside of 4H, in church and/or community activities, volunteer and/or work experience;
- o Strong interest in leadership development;
- o An ability to attend various meetings, events and activities during the program year; and
- Willingness to plan and/or participate in at least one leadership or community service project through the Junior All-Stars Program.
