4-H Policy and Information Update June 2016 (Repost)

The end of the 4-H program year is near (June 30) and I'm sure each of you has greatly impacted and enhanced the lives of the 4-H youth in your club. You have been a mentor, a leader, a teacher, a facilitator, a coach, and a friend to 4-Hers throughout the year. How can we harness the work you've done with them this year and translate it into the public having a better understanding of the work of 4-H? One way, is to have 4-H youth complete a record book. The record book documents in detail the value the program is having on the lives of 4-Hers and shows how impactful the experience has been. I encourage each of you to ask your 4-H members to consider doing a record book and capture their 4-H experience during this program year. I want to compile the information from the completed record books into a document that can be shown to county supervisors, state legislators and University of California representatives to demonstrate the value of the 4-H program.

It is my hope that the information I glean from the record books along with other evidence will continue to strengthen the perception and value of 4-H. The University of California, like other public institutions, continues to face the fiscal pressures of budgetary constraints, so the more we can document our worth, the better position 4-H looks.

• Macy 4-H Judging Day

Communications Committee, Macy 4-H Club

On February 27, 2016, Macy 4-H attended Judging Day at Palmdale High School. Judging Day improves the 4-H members' decision-making and critical thinking skills. Two weeks before the event, students started preparing for the competition by using last year's poster boards. They were taught how to complete the Written Reasoning section by practicing verbal responses in a small group. After prepping for several weeks, the students felt more confident representing their club at Judging Day.

Macy 4-H arrived at the high school at 8:15 a.m. and registered. They received their judging sheets and a map of the campus. Members were paired up and went from classroom to classroom to start their judging. Their judging sheets were based on categories such as livestock, plant science, horses and ponies, clothing and textiles, and leisure education. For every category, there were five to six posters that were related to the topic. On each poster, there was a question and four possible answers. Each member had to rank the answers from best to worst according to the question. One out of the five or six posters required the participants to write a justification of their answer. After turning in their judging sheets, volunteers evaluated them based on certain criteria.

After the judging part of the day was over, members were given an hour and a half for lunch. The adult volunteers spent that time tabulating the scores. At 1:30 p.m., the award ceremony began and everyone who earned first, second, and third place received their pins in each category. Gold represented the highest ranking, silver was second, and bronze was third. Some people were able to reach the top twenty percent and were acknowledged with certificates. From Macy 4-H, 11 members received a total of 22 pins: 3 pins were gold, 8 were silver, and 11 were bronze. Macy 4-H is proud of the effort that their members showed.

Overall, Judging Day was a rewarding and exciting experience for all the students who competed. At the event, members were asked to rank items from best to worst which improved their ability to analyze and use their best judgment. The club's performance was a success because they were awarded a total of 22 pins. Their hard work and dedication definitely paid off!

Communications Committee, Macy 4-H Club

On Saturday, March 19, 2016, Macy 4-H attended Field Day at Mount San Antonio College. Field Day is an annual event for 4-H members to demonstrate their public speaking skills. Macy 4-H has been getting ready for this day since mid-February. The members started off by choosing which categories they wanted to participate in. Then, they decided which topics they were going to cover, brainstormed some ideas, and shared them with the other members. This process helped prepare students for the actual competition.

The members from Macy 4-H won a total of 60 awards: 36 were gold, 20 were blue, and 4 were red. Gold represents the highest possible ranking, blue awards are similar to second place, and red awards are comparable to third. There were 21 students that competed and a total of 60 categories that the members placed in. The club is proud of everyone who participated in this event. All the weeks of practice and preparation paid off with the amount of pins that the club won.

For several weeks, Macy 4-H members met with their club advisor after school to rehearse their prepared speeches and their reading selection. They also practiced the introductions that they would present to the judges. Some categories that they were able to participate in were: Interpretive Reading, Educational Display, Cultural Arts, and Prepared Speech. Several of the members prepared an interpretive reading, while others practiced their presentations out loud. Those that chose Educational Display made sure that their tri-fold boards looked visually appealing. They also made sure that both members had the same amount of information to share with the judges. A majority of the people who chose Cultural Arts ended up singing acapela or using musical instruments to accompany their presentation. For Prepared Speech, the students finished memorizing their speeches and worked on their oral delivery.

Macy 4-H had another successful year at Field Day! Not only did the members come home with plenty of medals to show for, they became more confident in their presentation skills. Now, students are less nervous and have more experience in competing with other clubs. Their motivation is at an all-time high. Members will definitely be striving for gold in the next level of competition known as Sectionals.

• Macy 4-H Silent Auction

On Thursday, May 5th, 2016, Macy 4-H held a silent auction to sell photographs. The auction took place at Macy Intermediate from 3:00 to 6:00 p.m. The pictures that were on display were taken by the 4-H members that were in the Photography Project last year. Most of the prints were random images that the members found fascinating in everyday life. The profit from the sales will be used to buy new cameras for the students. The money will also cover the costs of printing and matting the photographs for competitions later this year.

During the 2014-2015 academic school year, Macy 4-H participated in three different competitions. The competitions were the Montebello Unified School District PTA Visual Arts Contest, the 4-H State Field Day, and the Photography Contest at the Los Angeles County Fair. In preparation for these events, Macy 4-H held meetings to edit the photographs that they would submit. Ms. Lopez, the Adult Project Leader for the Photography Project, encouraged the members to take pictures of places, objects, and people that they found interesting. Select pictures were edited through the software, Lightroom, "a photo processor and image organizer." The photographs were later taken to be developed, matted, and then were ready to be entered into competition.

The silent auction was open to the public starting at 3:00 p.m. Matted photographs were placed on easels and displayed in the school library. On the tables, there were descriptions of the pictures along with the names and grades of the photographers. It also included the title of the photographs and all the awards it had won. There was a "Buy Now" table where pictures were sold at a bargain price of \$10. Those extra prints were never entered in a competition. As every buyer walked into the library, they were greeted by Mrs. Lopez, the parent volunteer. Every person signed in and was given an ID number. They were encouraged to walk around and look at all the pictures before they decided to place a bid on one. All the prints that were on display had a minimum bid; the ones that had won awards started at \$25 and the rest at \$20. A total of 20 prints were sold.

Macy 4-H sponsored the silent auction to raise money for the Photography Project. The event sold pictures taken by last year's members. Many of the student photographers found inspiration in everyday life, some pictures even had a special meaning. The auction was a great way to showcase all of the members' talents while also fundraising for the club. Future members of the club will definitely benefit from the new equipment that will be purchased for the Photography Project.

2016 LA County Record Book information is available on the LA County 4-H Youth Development Program website. For the LA County Record Book Competition, the 4-H online forms will need to be printed out and submitted as hard copy. 2015-2016 record books are due September 13, 2016 to the 4-H Office or September 14, 2016 to a LA County 4-H Incentives and Recognition Committee Member (Noel Keller, Judylynn Pelling, Carrie DeYoung, Peter Michel, Dee Keese). The LA County Awards Program will be held Saturday, October 22nd, after the LA County 4-H Pet Symposium.

Senior 4-H Members are eligible to enter the State Record Book Competition. State 4-H Record Book Competition is focused on selecting 4-H members who have demonstrated outstanding achievement in their 4-H Project Work. Books are evaluated against standard criteria. Those books displaying the most outstanding 4-H work, life skills development, and leadership and citizenship development are selected as state medalists and/or state winners. Currently, LA County 4-H evaluates member record books with a focus on a member-designated project area. Awards are given out in project areas. At the State Record Book Competition, books are judged for the overall achievement of the member, without regard to just one project area. This year, seniors will again be able to select a project area for their record book evaluation at the county level. LA County 4-H will be changing the County Record Book Evaluating to be in line with State 4-H Competitions.

It is time to finish up your 2015-2016 4-H work. The 2015-2016 4-H Program Year ends Thursday, June 30, 2016. All 4-H work done from July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016 can be included in your 2015-2016 4-H Record Book. Work done after June 30, 2016 should be included in the 2016-2017 4-H Program Year record books.

The 2016-2017 Program Year starts July 1, 2016. All 4-H Members must re-enroll to participate in 4-H. This is especially important for those 4-H Members participating in fairs and other summer month activities. For members graduating out of the program that will be finishing up their projects and/or going to fair need not re-enroll. The 4-H Fees for the coming 2016-2017 program year are **\$38 per youth and \$14 per adult**.
