- Plants also play a key role in maintaining the planet's basic environmental balance and ecosystem stability. They provide an important component of the habitats for the world's animal life.”

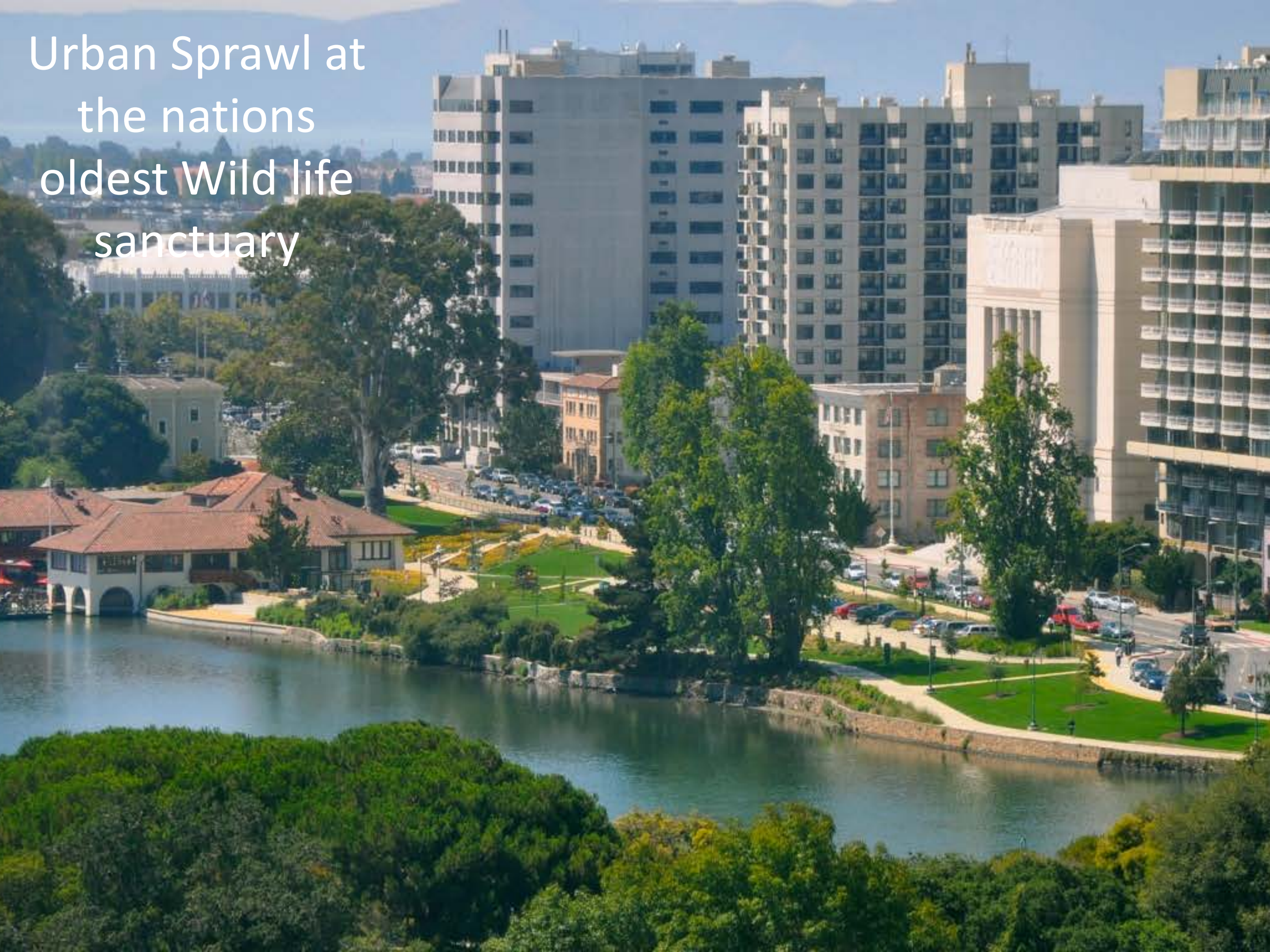
Why do we need Public Gardens?

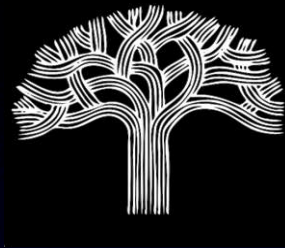
- A collection, small or large, of rare, endangered and native plants to help teach visitors the valuable lesson of conserving biodiversity.

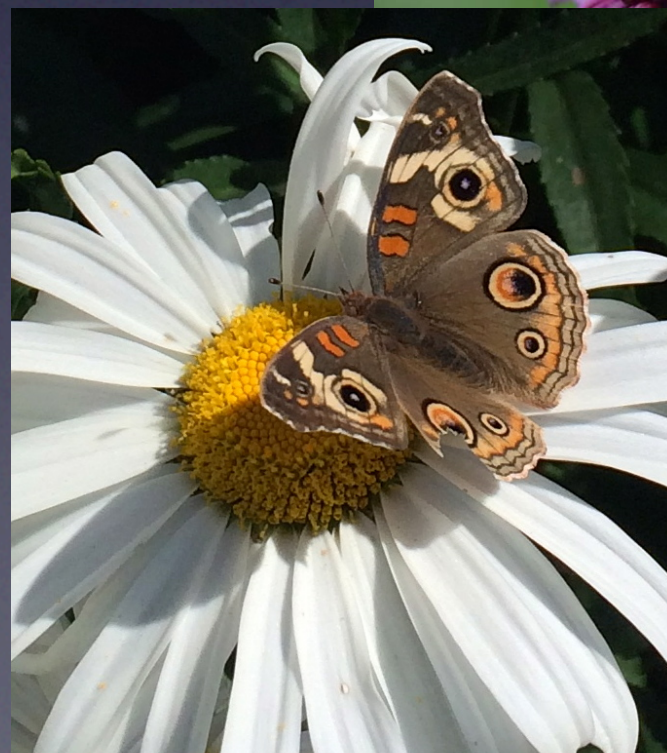
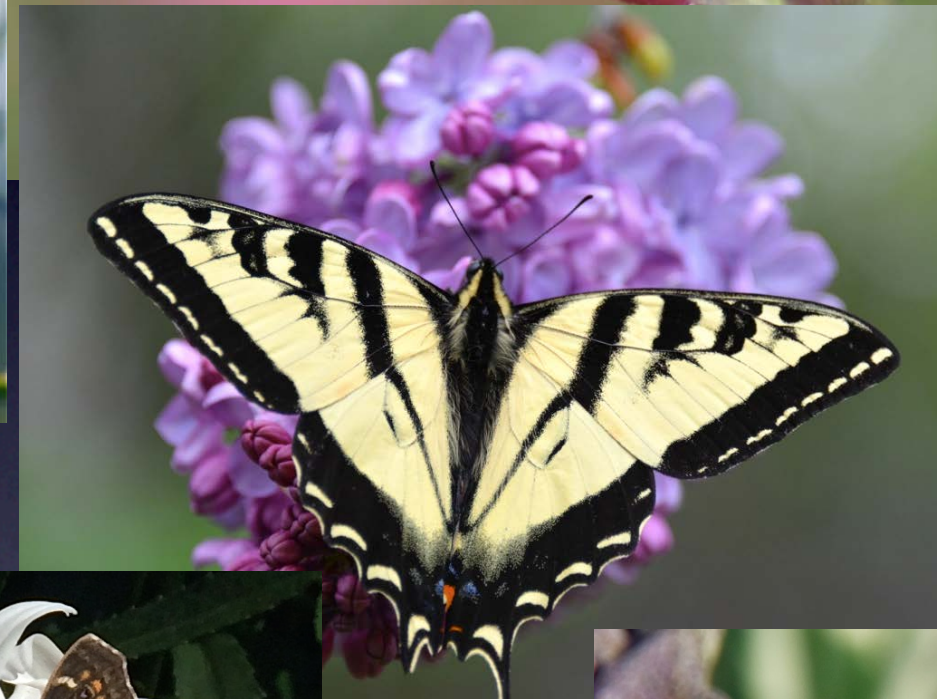

Forewing patch color is orange

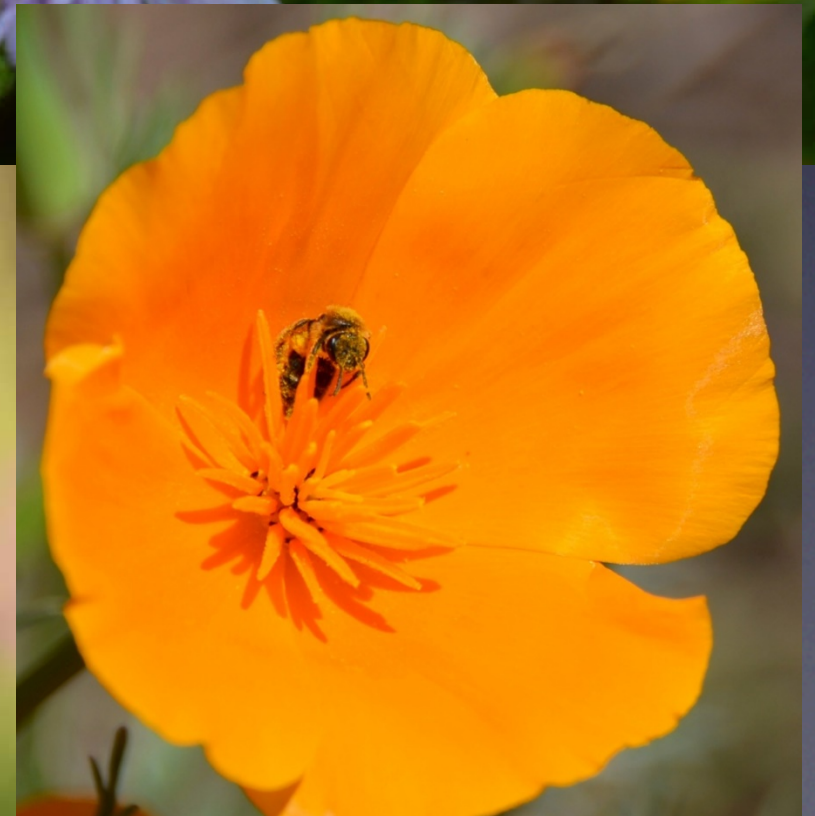
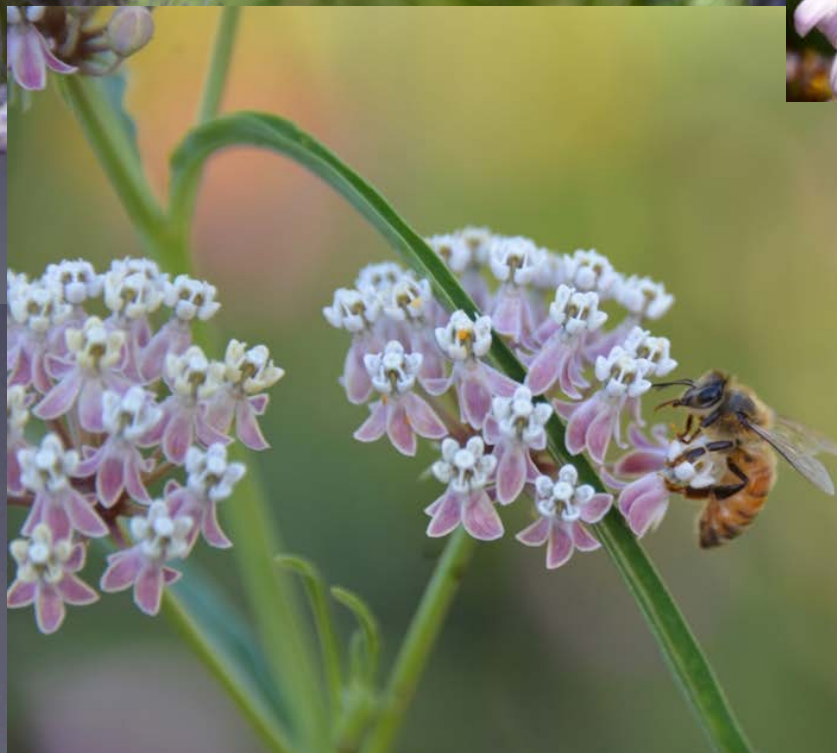
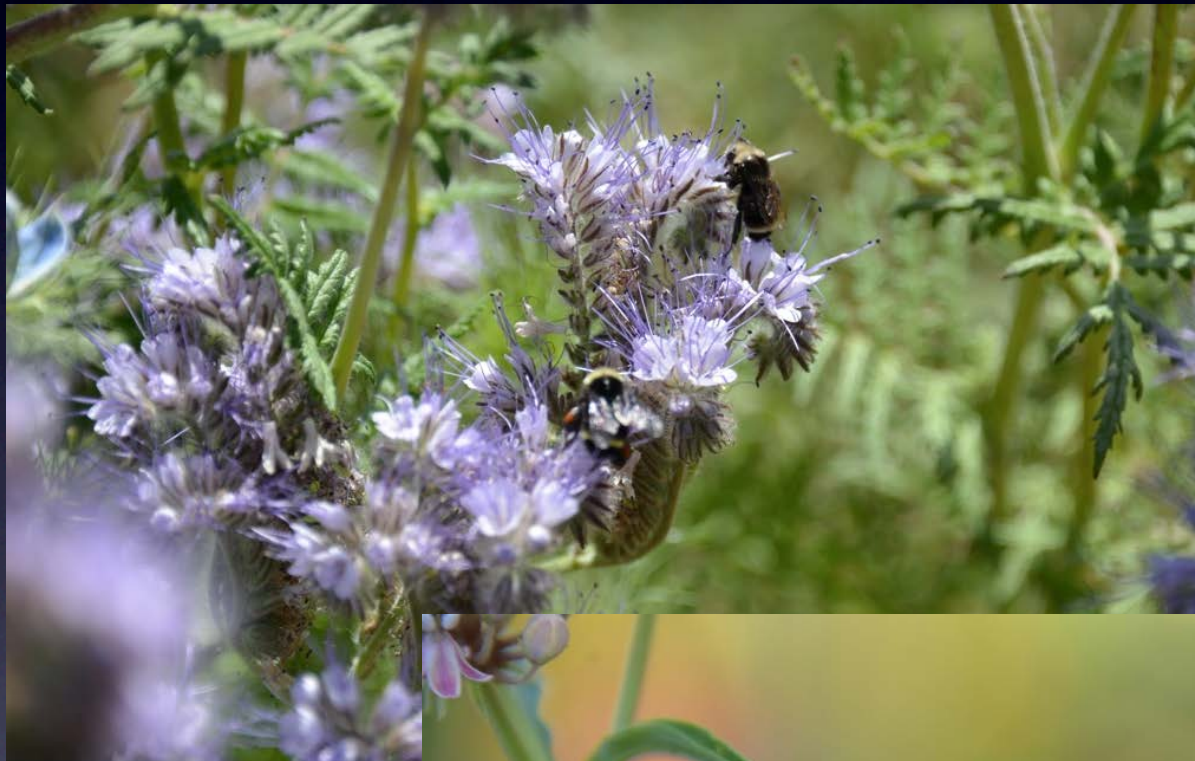

HAYWARD BLAKE, PUBLIC WORKS GRAFFITI ABATEMENT, BROUGHT THIS TO MY ATTENTION. BUMBLEBEES HAD SETUP HOUSEKEEPING IN AN ABANDONED BIRD NEST. THIS IS UNUSUAL, BECAUSE BUMBLEBEES TYPICALLY USE ABANDONED *RODENT* BURROWS. MANY BURROWS OF THE CALIFORNIA GROUND SQUIRREL CAN BE SEEN ABOUT OUR OFFICE ON EDGEWATER DR. THE BUMBLEBEES HAVE BEEN IDENTIFIED AS *BOMBUS MELANOPYRGUS EDWARDSII* (BLACK-TAILED BUMBLEBEE).

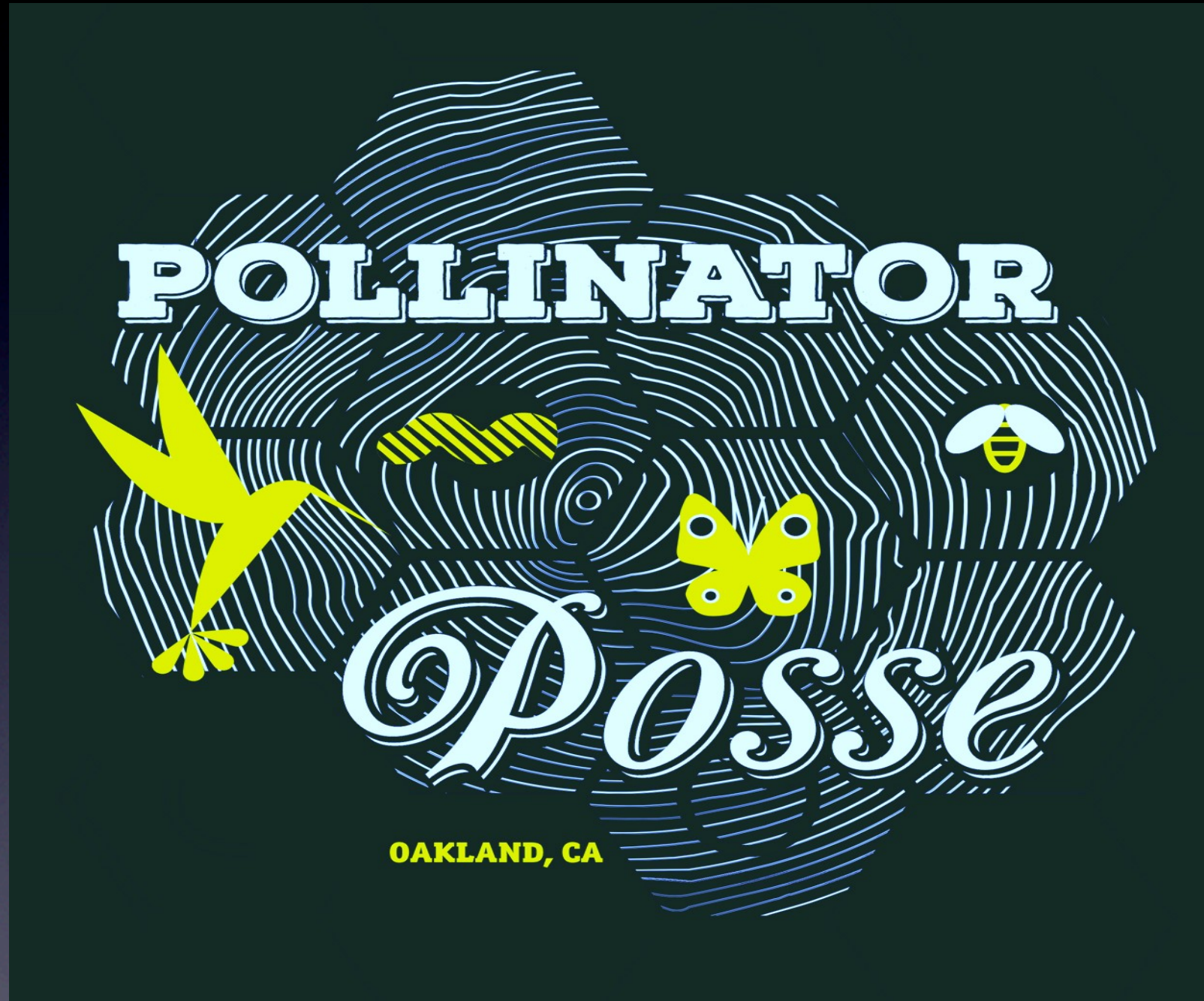
