POLICY

4-H Policy and Information Update June 2016

Each July 1, the 4-H Youth Development Program transitions to another year of positive youth development opportunities for youth. Youth and volunteers also have a chance to reflect on the past year's challenges and triumphs; projects and events; record books and reports. I want to highlight a few very important considerations as you begin the program year. First, make sure that all youth and adults are enrolled in the program for the current program year before beginning any 4-H activities or participating in any events as a 4-H member (i.e., fairs and exhibitions). It is important because of liability issues. To enroll in the 4-H program in Los Angeles County, please visit:

Second, be sure that the activities you are participating in are a part of your club's program plan and include a citizenship component, teaches a life skill and/or offers a leadership opportunity for the member. Having these key components are critical to ensuring that youth who participate in 4-H have a positive youth development experience.

Third, if you have not already, please prepare all of your club's financial records and be ready to submit the Treasurers' Book for auditing in September. The Youth Treasurer – along with the Adult Treasurer - should have all receipts, cancelled checks and invoices and has reconciled the club checking/saving account so that all expenses and income are accounted for. Remember, that money raised in the name of 4-H should be used to support the positive youth develop activities of the youth member so very little if any, should be rolled over to the next program year unless it's a part of a larger budgetary goal (i.e., raising funds for State Leadership Conference, raising funds to purchase a piece of livestock equipment).

All of these considerations can be found in the 4-H policy manual.

• PVP 4-H Field Trip to Madrona Marsh

Ironically, this is the end of the official 4-H year but this is my first report as a PVP 4-H reporter. On June 10,

2016 the PVP 4H Gardening project invited all club members to join them for an exciting journey through Madrona Marsh Wilderness Park. Cindy Reid, the leader of the Gardening group, is an avid gardener and a well-known and respected member of the Madrona March Wilderness preserve volunteers group. We are very lucky to have her as a leader for our gardening project. It appears that birds, butterflies and various small insects are Cindy's friends and come out to personally greet her as she walks by their hiding spots.



We started our journey at the well-equipped

laboratory inside the main building looking through microscopes.

We were able to identify and study the smallest creatures leaving in the seasonal ponds of the preserve. We learned that some of the species could dry out and stay alive for 10 years without water. The life in the water



there is abundant and fascinating. We made a lot of amazing discoveries about the secret lives of the smallest pond dwellers.

I won't tell much more about them, as you should definetly visit Madrona Lab, look under the microscope, and find it out for yourself. Most of the activities are free in the Madrona Preserve.

After the lab, on the way to the preserve, the group viewed many California native plants. We walked through the gardens and across the street into the preserve. The preserve is

a home of many drought tolerant plants. We saw the queen of buckwheat, wild California grapes and the

California golden poppy. We even saw a "Fried Egg" flower! The plant nursey in the preserve had small potted trees and plants waiting for planting by high school students and volunteers.

Despite the recent drought conditions, the pond was still surrounded by lush vegetation that provided shade for small Baja Chorus Frogs and various waterfowl including mallards and a snow heron. Our visit was concluded by taking a group photo on the picturesque bridge that spanned and overlooked the pond.





The staff at Modrona Marsh, many of whom had volunteered there for over 30 years, were extremely accommodating and added to the enjoyment of the field trip. The walk through the grounds was both pleasant and educational. We hardly noticed that our two hour trip had come to an end. Sadly, it was the time to say goodbye as Cindy locked the gate. See you next year!

We are looking forward to come back in September to continue with the various PVP 4-H activities.

Communications Committee, Macy 4-H Club

Throughout the 2015-2016 school year, Macy 4-H Communications Committee has completed 2many articles and bulletin boards. Our bulletin board designs show the students at Macy Intermediate the different projects that are going on.

Even though it is a huge commitment on our part, as students, we have learned the importance of cooperation and working together. This project has taught us that you have to work hard to achieve your goals.
