POLICY

The University of California 4-H Youth Development Program is a major effort and central to the mission of the University of California Cooperative Extension. Because of this effort and its position with the University, the Division of Agriculture and Natural Resources has overall responsibility for the development, efficiency and effectiveness of the 4-H Youth Development Program.

4-H Units and Councils (when authorized by the issuance of a 4-H Charter) are granted certain privileges and responsibilities related to financial activities. All monies raised and managed by 4-H units must be done so in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and within the policies and procedures specified by the 4-H Handbook (4-H Policy Manual). The policy extends to funds generated in the name of 4-H by the adult volunteers, parents/guardians and members of al 4-H units and councils.

All monies raised under the guise of 4-H and with the use of the name and emblem are to be treated according these established policies. Council treasurers and 4-H staff are responsible for ensuring that units comply, with the County Director having the final local authority on fundraising and club unit funds.

We thank the SSG district for providing lunches for the evaluators. We congratulate all the 4-H members who turned in their record books and for their accomplishments.

55 4-H Members (11 Juniors, 23 Intermediates and 21 Seniors) turned in their 2015-2016 4-H Records for evaluation. All Senior Books were reviewed for Senior Awards of Excellence in Leadership, Community Service, Achievement, Project Work, S.E.T. and Healthy Living. 9 Officer Books were submitted for recognition.

21 Junior and Teen Leaders asked to have their records evaluated for a Junior/Teen Leader Merit Award.

Along with the members using the new 2015-2016 record book forms, the record book evaluators used new forms from the state for evaluating the record books. This was an introduction to these new evaluation forms. The evaluators were asked to score the new forms but not total them. The scores were not used this year to determine the award for the record book. Members and leaders are asked to be aware of these new evaluation guidelines from the state 4-H office for completing record books this year. The new record book evaluation forms will be available on the county website.

The results of the record book evaluation will be announced at the County Awards program on Oct. 22 at Belvedere Park around 2:30pm, after the county Pet Symposium, and will be listed in the November issue of Clover Notes.

New Record Book Manual for 2016-2017

The state 4-H office has released a new 2016-2017 California 4-H Record Book Manual, which is now considered to be the current manual and we are told to discard all previous record book manuals. Please use this manual for your 4-H records this year (2016-2017). A second manual California 4-H Record Book Forms 2016-2017 contains the forms to use with the first 2016-2017 instruction manual. Please use these forms for your records this year. Across the top of each form is the phrase "California 4-H Record Book 2016-2017". DO NOT USE FORMS FROM PRIOR 4-H RECORD BOOK MANUALS. A third record book manual for leaders was also released from the state office. The California 4-H Record Book Manual Adult Partner's Guide 2016-2017 gives further clarification of the instructions to complete a record book. We have all three of these manuals on the county website. These manuals are also on the state 4-H website.

There are some changes for 4-H record keeping. Be sure to look at these new manuals as you record your 4-H activities during the year. The county I&R committee will be discussing the impact of these manuals on our county record book evaluating program.
