Attention all Dog Project Members and Dog Lovers

The canine flu has hit California with a vengeance. Canine Influenza, or dog flu, is a highly contagious virus with 72 reported cases in California in the past month and a half.

Symptoms of Canine Influenza include fever, cough, sneezing, nasal discharge, lethargy, and loss of appetite. Some dogs do not show any symptoms at all. Most dogs recover with care in 2-3 weeks, but more serious complications can occur, including pneumonia and death.

Canine flu is spread by direct contact and/or contact with contaminated items such as bowls or toys. The virus can survive for 1-2 days on hard surfaces. Canine flu can spread rapidly at places dogs get together. Avoid dog parks until this disease has subsided. Young dogs are especially at risk as are older ones.

Owners should take their animals to a veterinarian if they are sick, and not take their dogs out in public or to other places where they will encounter other dogs, if they are showing signs of illness. Pets should be kept up to date on vaccines.

Dog project members should visit Dr. Zachary. Let him know you are in the dog project and he will only charge you for the vaccine. If you go to another veterinarian make sure they are using the most current bivalent form of the vaccine, made by Merc. This brand seems to be the most effective in combating this disease. This vaccine can be expensive. It comes in a series of two shots, two weeks apart.

Fun with Rock-hounding

What is 4-H? The first thing many people associate it with are animals! But 4-H is more than just pets and livestock! 4-H can be about many things. It all starts with the project leader volunteers!

This year our club was fortunate to have a Rocks and Minerals Project! Several fun things about this project are: learning how rocks are made, the differences between a mineral and crystal, and going out in the field to hunt rocks!

Anyone can be a Rock-hound, but knowing where to go and dig helps! I want to share three places of interest for those who are crazy about rocks:

Rosamond's Gem Hill is located near Rosamond, CA and is well known to rockhounds. This site holds specimens such as agates, jasper and green common opal. You may also get lucky and find some petrified palm root as well. Make sure you bring a pick, shovel, and protective eyewear. You will have to dig out the good specimens in the hard earth.

Trona's Gem-O-Rama in Trona, CA is an event that usually takes place every second weekend in October. There are three digs you can register for: mud dig, blow hole, and the pink Halite. I have done the mud dig and found great specimens of Hanksite. Trona, Borax and Pink Halite are some other specimens you can find.

There is a great rock and lapidary show too, just be ready to get really muddy!

Borax Museum in Boron, CA has the largest Borax mining pit in the world! The museum talks about the mining process and the types of Borax minerals mined. Many of these Boron elements are found in your everyday household products. As a bonus there are three large ore deposits of Ulexite, Kernite and Tincal for the public to take home a sample of.

Shotgun Leader Workshop

If you have an interest in sharing your shotgun skills with youth, how about becoming a 4-H Shotgun adult volunteer or teen leader. There will be a 4-H Shotgun leader certification training offered in April 2018.

This class will be Saturday April 21st 9 AM –4 PM, and Sunday, April 22nd, 9 AM - 2 PM, at the Safety First Shooting Association, River Oaks Range, 11584 Shaffer Rd, Winton 95388, in Merced County. This class is being hosted by Merced County 4-H. You must become a 4-H leader or member and attend both days to receive certification to teach Shotgun at the project, club and camp levels. The course will include a PowerPoint lecture, review of equipment, practice shooting and teaching, and a written test. The cost is \$35 per person to include a resource binder, with Saturday and Sunday light breakfast and refreshments. You need to bring your own lunch.

Junior and teen leaders are invited but must attend with an adult or have a certified Shotgun adult leader they will be helping back home.

2018 California 4-H State Archery Match



University of California Cooperative Extension - Nevada County

Welcome to the 6th Annual State 4-H Archery Shooting Sports Match, sponsored by the Nevada County 4-H Council!

Entries for the State 4-H Archery Match, must be postmarked by **April 20, 2018.** The rules are below and we rely upon the guidance of leaders and advisors in order to avoid confusion and problems. Practicing before the start of the contest is encouraged. Once the contest begins members will shoot only 18 arrows (6 ends of 3 arrows each) at each distance and **ONLY** score those 18 arrows. Targets will be shipped to the UCCE offices as soon as the checks and entries are received. As the Host Club, Nevada County will make every effort to ensure the targets and score cards are shipped in time to accommodate the archery schedule of your club. Each club will receive one 80 cm FITA target and one pre-printed score card for every entry (5.00 fee = 1 entry). Targets will not be labeled or assigned. Leaders are free to utilize them as they choose and retain any un-used targets for their club.

ALL ENTRANTS MUST BE VERIFIED AS BEING CURRENTLY ENROLLED IN 4-H BY YOUR LOCAL UCCE OFFICE

DIVISIONS (by age, as of December 31, 2017):

Junior: 9-10 years of age Intermediate: 11-13 years of age Senior: 14-19 years of age

CATEGORIES:

- Longbow Fingers and wooden arrows only
- Recurve Bow no sights Fingers only, 60 lb. maximum draw weight, Any length stabilizers & torque compensators, No string peeps, No mechanical releases
- Recurve Bow with sights; Fingers only, any number of sight pins, kisser buttons and clickers OK, 60 lb. maximum draw weight, any length stabilizers & torque compensators, no string peeps, no mechanical releases
- Compound- without sights (including Genesis bows); Any bow that uses pulley, wheels or cams, fingers or mechanical releases, any length stabilizers & torque compensators, 60 lb. maximum draw weight
- Compound- with sights: any bow that uses pulley, wheels or cams, fingers or mechanical releases, any type of sight with any number of pins or optical sights, any length stabilizers & torque compensators, string peeps OK, 60 lb. maximum draw weight
- 6. First Time Shooters Only for first time shooters, all ages and all categories will shoot at 10 yards only. Rules and scoring will be the same as the rest of the match. A First Time Shooter is defined as a 4-H participant who is new to the sport of archery. Participants who have had previous experience or instruction in archery (4-H, professional, scholastic, parental, etc.) are not considered "beginners" in the sport and will NOT compete as First Time Shooters.

7. Leaders - For registered 4-H Archery Leaders only. Leaders must be registered by Jan. 1, 2018

**** Leaders will be responsible for the correct classification of all archers in their clubs. Incorrect classifications may result in disqualification. Please contact the Host Club with any questions ****

RULES:

- 1. Arrows may not be larger than 23/64ths in diameter for both traditional and compound categories.
- Full color FITA targets, 80cm faces, will be mailed along with score cards, to be used for the competition.
- 3. Scoring is 10 points to 1 point from the center outward. Ties will be decided by number of "X's".
- 4. The shooting distances for Junior are: 10, 20, and 30 yards.
- 5. The shooting distances for Intermediate are: 20, 30, and 40 yards
- 6. The shooting distances for Senior are: 30, 40, and 50 yards.
- 7. The shooting distance for Leaders is 50 yards. Leaders shoot 6 ends of 3 arrows each.
- 8. For each category, the participant will shoot 6 ends of 3 arrows each.
- A member may enter any or all of the 5 categories with a maximum of three distances per category.Distances outside of the archer's Division (age group) will not count for awards.
- 10. The entry fee is \$5.00 for each category and distance entered.
- 11. All entries must be verified by the county 4-H staff that participants are currently enrolled in 4-H archery. Leaders must be UCCE certified to be eligible.
- 12. Entry fees may be paid ONLY by a check from the local 4-H council.
- 13. Make checks payable to Nevada County 4-H. Mail entries and one council check to;

Nevada County Sportsmens Club 11296 Banner Mtn. Trail, Nevada City, CA 95959,

Attn: 4-H Archery - Postal postmarked by April 20, 2018.

- 14. Late entries will be reviewed and accepted ONLY in extenuating circumstances. Absolutely no entries will be accepted after April 30, 2018.
- 15. Once the match has begun, only the targets scored during the match are to be entered. This means that members will only shoot 18 arrows (6 ends of 3 arrows each) at each distance and score only those 18 arrows.
- 16. All targets must be shot and scored in the presence of a certified 4-H archery leader.
- All completed score cards must be returned to UCCE Nevada County and postmarked by July 2, 2018 to be eligible for awards. No late score cards will be accepted.
- 18. After score cards are verified, the results will be distributed through the UCCE offices. Awards will be sent to the UCCE offices of participating counties for archery leaders to distribute.

AWARDS:

First Time Shooters will compete only against each other by Division (age) and Category.

The top 3 scores in each division/category will receive medals/pins. 1^{St} – Gold, 2^{nd} Silver, 3^{rd} Bronze

4th and 5th place in each division/category will receive ribbons

Participation certificates will be awarded to ALL shooters who have returned completed score sheets.

Leaders may shoot in any/all categories at 50 yards. Entry fees are the same for leaders as for 4-H participants. Leaders will receive 1st through 5th place awards, but are not eligible for trophies.

Trophies Awarded:

Hot Shot/ Outstanding Archer – awarded to the archer with the highest total score in the 2018 Postal Match. Archers must shoot all three distances for their respective age group to be eligible for this award. Each category/style (compound, recurve, etc.) any archer shoots will be counted as a separate entry into the Hot Shot competition.

Team Edge Award – named in recognition of Linda Edgington, UCCE Mendocino, for all her hard work and dedication to the State Match. This award will be given to the individual club with the highest average score in the 2018 Match. All correctly classified scores count toward the team average: First-Time, Junior, Intermediate and Senior.

Awards will be mailed to the participating UCCE office by August 31, 2018

Score cards must be postmarked no later than July 2, 2018. No late score cards will be accepted.

4-H SHOOTING SPORTS – HUNTING PROJECT/ CALIFORNIA HUNTER EDUCATION COURSE

This project covers the information required to take the California hunter education test and obtain your hunter safety certificate. The hunter safety certificate allows you to purchase a hunting license or hunt in other states that require proof of having passed a hunter education course. The project is open to junior, intermediate, and senior 4-H members (no Cloverbuds). The six meetings will take place at the UC Cooperative Extension Office, 1031 S. Mt. Vernon Avenue, Bakersfield. Students should bring a writing utensil and paper to each class.

At the end of this course, each student is expected to demonstrate proper safety procedures with firearms and pass the written exam with a minimum passing score of 80% or better. Failure to pass the written exam prohibits the student from obtaining his/her hunter safety certificate, and she/he must retake the entire course. State law requires that each student attend every session. Missing one or more class sessions automatically drops the student from the course. Being tardy for class is also grounds for dropping a student.

Class size is limited to 25 students. You must register for the course online by going to this link: https://www.register-ed.com/programs/california/160 This will be a "traditional" course so you will need to look under the registration link for traditional courses in Bakersfield.



2018 FAIR BOOK HAS BEEN APPROVED and will be online around the middle of March

Listed below are some of the general changes.

- All Large animal projects will need DNA kits purchased, completed and
 returned to the livestock office. The DNA kit will include an Ear Tag for you
 to put in your animal's ear. No animal will need to go to the fair for tag in.
 More information for this to come.
- ALL Entries will be done online only! (NO PAPER ENTRIES ALLOWED)
- **NEW Division for Small Animals.** Special Junior/ Independent (Cloverbuds). Five to Eight years old as of January 1st, 2018 will all be in this division. Please do not enter under 4-H Division.
 - a) Cloverbuds are able to show chickens, rabbits, Pygmy goats and Nigerian goats only.
 - b) **No** Market Turkeys, Meat Pen chickens, Fryers or Meat Pen of rabbits
 - c) They will not be able to sell any animal at the KCF.
 - d) They will be able to get Premium Money and Awards
 - e) Uniform: White Pants, White Collared Shirt and Black Tie (No 4-H insignia No 4-H Hats/Scarves)
 - f) They will have their own Showmanship Division.
- Ear Tags: No tags will be turned into the fair if you have more than 2 animals. Lost ear tags procedures will be the same.
- Replacement Animals: There is NO replacement! If your animal dies, you
 will not be able to replace it. We suggest tagging and entering more than 1
 animal if possible.
- All animals not making weight and not meeting the showmanship rule, must be removed from the grounds the evening of weigh-in.

- Buyers with total combined auction bill of \$500.00 or less, must be paid on or before the day of sale. If not paid there will be an additional fee of \$25.00 applied.
- Market Beef (1000 to 1450 lbs.)
- Miniature Market Beef (300 to 800 lbs.)
- Market Swine (215 to 270 lbs.)
- Market Sheep (110 to 165 lbs.)
- Market Goats (60 to 125 lbs.)
- Market Turkeys (minimum 14 lbs. and not older than 30 weeks)
- Market Meat Pen Poultry (Minimum of 3lbs. and maximum of 7 lbs. per bird)
- Meat Pen of 3 Rabbits and Fryers (follow ARBA rules for weight)
- SALE: Each exhibitor is allowed to sell One Large Animal Project, One Small Project, and One Ag Mechanics Project (open to everyone through Harvest Hall rules). Rabbits and chickens must be meat projects not regular animals.
- Theme: "Fair Friends Forever"
- Please carefully check the Show Time Table in the front of the book when the book comes out. Make sure you check all times and dates. There are numerous changes.

The book should be online by the middle of March and when the printed version comes out we will let everyone know.
