Calling for Adult 4-H leaders to step forward and be part of the 4-H Council leadership for the 2018 - 2019 4-H year! Below are the responsibilities that go with the Officer of Treasurer, which will be open in the 2018-2019 year.

Treasurer

The Treasurer shall keep accurate, up-to-date records of all financial receipts and disbursements of the Leaders' Council and shall provide a report at each meeting. The Treasurer shall prepare the financial record of the Leaders' Council for audit at the end of each fiscal year. The Treasurer shall notify Section and/or County Leaders' Council for funds due.

Facilities Reminder

Are you holding meetings (project, committee, or community club) at a location which is other than a personal residence? If so, you should be submitting a Facility Use Request to the 4-H Office! Please remember that all requests for facility use of school, city, county, state & private facilities <u>must</u> be sent to the 4-H Office to be filled out by the 4-H staff. Please include details of location, time, dates and purpose. **Remember, forms and contracts of any kind can <u>only</u> be signed by the County Director!**

Fundraiser Pre-Approval Reminder

Please remember that all fundraisers must get pre-approval from the 4-H Office before the fundraising can start. Please fill out Form 8.7 – Fundraising Approval from the 4-H Treasurer's Manual or get the form from the Butte County 4-H website, http://cebutte.ucanr.edu/4-H_Program/Forms/, and turn it into the 4-H Office for approval at least 2 weeks prior to your fundraising activity. All fundraisers must be pre-approved!

Food Safety Certification

Annual training is required for adult volunteers who are involved with food service and preparation where the general public is involved. This includes all fundraising and community service activities. Any club anticipating involvement in food service and preparation activities must have at least one member complete this training. Please note that any food related fundraisers submitted to the 4-H Office will be reviewed for club compliance with this policy. This training is also highly recommended for any project leaders running a food related project. The University's "Make It Safe, Keep It Safe" Food Safety Education has been made available in an online format, and can be accessed at http://ucanr.edu/sites/MISKIS/Intro/. The training consists of six learning modules, as well as a pre and post-test. The post-test consists of 11 multiple choice questions and must be completed with a passing score of 80% in order to receive credit and certification. We have been experiencing some issues with the reporting system, so please e-mail Nicole Marshall at mmarshall@ucanr.edu with the date and time of completion and print a copy of your results for submission to the 4-H Office.

MARKET ANIMAL WEIGHT LIMITS - TOP WEIGHTS RE-ESTABLISHED! See Local Rule #77:

- Market Steers: 1000–1350 lbs. Max. weight 1450 lbs. Steers weighing less than 1000 lbs. or more than 1450 lbs. will be disqualified at the scale & will not be eligible for Jr Livestock Auction. Exhibitors will be paid for up to 1350 lbs.
- Market Hogs: 210–280 lbs. Max. weight 290 lbs. Hogs that weigh less than 210 lbs. or more than 290 lbs. will be disqualified at the scale and will not be eligible for Jr Livestock Auction. Exhibitors will be paid for up to 280 lbs.
- Market Lambs: 100-150 lbs. Max. weight 160 lbs. Lambs weighing less than 100 lbs. or more than 160 lbs. will be disqualified at the scale and will not be eligible for Jr Livestock Auction. Exhibitors will be paid for up to 150 lbs.
- Market Goats: 60–105 lbs. Max. weight 115 lbs. Goats that weigh less than 60 lbs. or more than 115 lbs. will be disqualified at the scale and will not be eligible for Jr. Livestock Auction. Exhibitors will be paid for up to 105 lbs.
- **Rabbit Meat Pens**: 3 rabbits comprise a Rabbit Meat Pen. Each must weigh a min. of 3 ½ lbs. & no more than 5 ½ lbs. Meat Pens that do not meet weight requirements are not eligible for the Jr Livestock Auction. Rabbits are sold by the pen.
