A Statewide Collaborative Project Between UC 4 - H, UC CalFresh, and EFNEP

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Introduction

The Teens-as-Teacher (TAT) model provides many programmatic benefits. Teens are empowered through an opportunity to learn, grow and serve their communities, while program recipients receive high quality programming through a youth-adult partnership. Utilizing a TAT model helps county programs expand their current efforts, reaching new youth that they may not otherwise have the opportunity to serve. To support this expansion effort, UC 4-H, UC CalFresh, and EFNEP have teamed up to engage in collaborative nutrition education programming across the state. Program integration supports cross-disciplinary activities to increase program capacity, build on programmatic strengths, reduce duplication of services and identify new funding opportunities.
