Please remember, while a volunteer is still pending and not approved/active, they are not considered a 4-H volunteer leader, and thus may not hold project meetings, act as chaperones, be active in Club or County leadership positions, are not covered by 4-H accident/sickness insurance, and are not covered by UC's liability insurance.

ANY RETURNING VOLUNTEER THAT IS STILL PENDING AFTER JANUARY 31ST WILL NOT BE ABLE TO CONTINUE LEADING THEIR PROJECTS AND THUS RISK THEIR MEMBERS NOT BEING ABLE TO SHOW AT FAIR

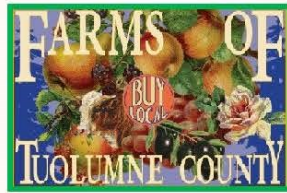
Hi 4-H
