2018-2019 State 4-H Program Fees

4-H is the first and largest youth development organization in the world, and for over 100 years has been preparing young people ages 5 to 19 with the skills they need to lead for a lifetime. Annual program fees paid by members and volunteers help support fundamental services, including staff, insurance, program development, resources, events, and required online systems to sustain and enhance exceptional programming for nearly 110,000 members and 15,500 adult volunteers. Over the coming years, state program fees are projected to increase to cover the usual costs for program operations.

For the 2018-2019 program year, starting July 1, 2018, fees will be \$54 for youth and \$18 for adult volunteers. Counties and clubs may also have a separate fee. We believe that 4-H should be accessible to everyone and, therefore, fee waivers will continue to be available for qualifying families (contact the local County 4-H Office for more information). 4-H is still relatively inexpensive compared to other youth activities such as youth football or soccer (which start at several hundred dollars a season). And, youth who participate in 4-H are more likely to excel in school, participate and be interested in science, make more healthy choices, contribute to their communities and thrive today and in the future.

The University of California, Division of Agriculture and Natural Resources administers 4-H and provides significant support to cover operational costs, including funding for nearly half of all county-based staff positions and all Advisor positions. The State 4-H Office will continue to raise funds to help alleviate projected increases and develop new revenue streams to support 4-H in order to keep costs *as low as possible* for families.

- ✓ Pay leader fees of \$18.00 to club (some clubs cover leader fees)
- ✓ Conduct a minimum of 6 hours of instruction through project group meetings, workshops, field trips, etc.
- ✓ Involve experienced Junior/Teen leaders in projects.
- ✓ Make a one year commitment to the project group.

New Year Enrollment Now Open

Leaders – please encourage members to complete ca4honline https://ca.4honline.com/ enrollment soon after the kick off of the new program year began July 1, 2018. All members exhibiting at fall fairs must be enrolled, paid, confirmed, and activated prior to fairs. The County 4-H Office will be asked to validate all participants. Members not activated in the system 2 weeks prior to fairs may be disqualified as exhibitors.

Families – please note you MUST LOG IN TO EXISTING FAMILY PROFILES when enrolling. Duplicate accounts create time consuming administrative issues. If you are unable to log in to your existing family profile, please contact the 4-H Office for assistance (559) 241-7515.

Adult Volunteers – Great news regarding the online training courses. The State 4-H Office has revised the courses and shortened the length considerably. For "Returning Volunteers" course time dropped from 1 ½ hours to 30 minutes. For the "New Volunteers" it dropped from 3 hours to 2 ½. - 3. Adults must complete the mandatory online training courses
- 4. Livescan (fingerprints) required on all new volunteers
- 5. County office activates once ALL steps completed. You CANNOT hold project meetings until activated.



Online applications are now being accepted for the 2019 4-H Shooting Sports National Championships in Grand Island, Nebraska. Applications are due online by October 1, 2018. After October 1st, a panel composed of members from the State 4-H Shooting Sports Advisory Committee reviews the applications and makes the selections of those who will attend the event. Applicants are notified if they have been selected by the end of October. SHOOTING SPORTS WORKSHOPS

Archery, Rifle, & Shotgun Disciplines September 8 & 9, 2018 – Winton, CA (Merced County)

There will be three workshops to certify 4-H adult volunteers as Shooting Sports Leaders or Trainers in the Shooting Sports disciplines of "Shotgun Project Leader", "Rifle Project Leader", and "Archery Project Leader" presented in Merced County on the weekend of September 8th and 9th. You may only attend one workshop for a specific shooting sports discipline and you must attend both days to be certified. By doing these three popular workshops on the same weekend it will allow counties to ride share and get several shooting sports disciplines completed to bring back to their county. If you have backgrounds in one of these shooting sports disciplines and have a desire to teach youth, why not step up and share your expertise!

This class will be Saturday Sept 8th, 9 AM –4 PM, and Sunday, Sept 9th, 9 AM - 2 PM, at the Safety First Shooting Association, River Oaks Range Firearms Training Center, 11584 Shaffer Rd, Winton 95388, in Merced County.

This class is being hosted by Merced County 4-H. You must become a 4-H leader and attend both days to receive certification to teach the specific shooting sport at the project, club and camp levels. The course will include a PowerPoint lecture, review of equipment, practice shooting and teaching, and a written test. The cost is \$35 per person to include a resource binder, with Saturday and Sunday lite breakfast refreshments. Bring your own lunch each day.

Junior and teen leaders are invited but must attend with an adult or have a certified Shooting sports adult leader they will be helping back home.
