About 4-H Record Books

The 4-H program has a long history of record keeping. The focus reflects the importance of this life skill in our daily lives. Completing a 4-H Record Book is a process where you record project and club work using a standard format.

Why have 4-H Record Books?

Completing the Personal Development Report in the Record Book provides you an incentive for participation, learning, and achievement.

Benefits of completing a 4-H Record Book:

- **Practice Records Management** - Track your activities, events, profits and losses, skill development and learning experiences. In this competency skill you identify, create, classify, archive and preserve records.
- **Reflect on your yearly work** - Document your skill development and learning experiences in a written report.
- **Measure your achievements and growth throughout your years in 4-H.**
- **Set goals, pursue strategies to meet those goals, and record how you may have had to shift gears in the face of challenges and obstacles.**

We have forms for Primary Members to start learning the skill of Record Management. **Note:** Primary Members are *not* required to complete reports forms to receive their annual stripe and pin.

The State 4-H Advisory Committees provide leadership and offer insight, review and input to the Statewide 4-H Director (Shannon Horrillo, sjhorrillo@ucanr.edu) for the operation and management of the 4-H Youth Development Program. Advisory Committees are comprised of a representative group of 4-H youth, adult volunteers, county and state 4-H staff and program partners.

Committee Chair Responsibilities

Committee Chairs are appointed by the Statewide 4-H Director. Responsibilities include:

- Convening and facilitating committee meetings
- Ensuring the committee fulfills its charge
- Reviewing and providing feedback on candidates for their committee
- Developing an annual budget, which is approved by the Statewide 4-H Director

Sharing committee work with all program stakeholders

Committee Responsibilities

- Committee terms start on July 1st. Youth terms are one year, renewable for an additional year; Adult Volunteers and Partner terms are for two years.
- Committees meet throughout the year, through face-to-face meetings, conference calls, and email communications in order to conduct committee business.
- Reimbursement for Travel Costs: *All travel costs and related expenses for Advisory Committee members are reimbursed by the State 4-H Office in accordance with University policy.*

What is 4-H Summer Camp?

4-H Summer Camp is a week long overnight camp experience for enrolled members of the 4-H Youth Program in Southern California and throughout the country. Volunteer camp staff (minimum age 14), in conjunction with five adult directors plan the camp program from January until camp begins during the third or fourth week of June. At regular meetings and staff training events they plan the games, skits, songs, nature activities, hikes, swimming events, arts and crafts projects, activities, S.E.T. curriculum, etc. to give camp participants a week of fun they will always remember.

The camp activities are planned, organized and led by the youth staff. Campers are divided into four teams with staff members as leaders. Teams meet every day to plan activities such as skits, hikes, attend nature education sessions, team activities and have fun. Camp is a place to meet people and make life-long friendships. You must be at least 8 years old to attend 4-H Camp and currently enrolled in the 4-H youth program. A parent or guardian must accompany 8 year olds at camp as a chaperone. All this for only \$300 for the 6 night camp experience.
