

The LA County Junior All-Star Program is a non-competitive leadership program targeting


youth in 8th through 11th grades or 13 and older. Junior All-Star Application is due October 1.



Space Exploration of the Sun

Technology has allowed scientists and engineers to undertake what has seem to be an impossible endeavor a reality. It allows a forward understanding of the world we live in and its surroundings like the Sun. On August 12, 2018, NASA launched a spacecraft named Parker Solar Probe to explore where no other spacecraft has gone before. This probe will orbit around the sun 24 times during its seven-year mission. Each time sweeping through its' corona, where it is 2,500 degrees Fahrenheit (almost 1,400 degrees Celsius). The probe will help scientists explore regions of the Sun's atmosphere. It will also allow scientists to learn more things on stellar mechanics. Stellar mechanics is the branch of



astrophysics which describes in a statistical way the collective motions of stars subject to their mutual gravity.
