



Bake Day Online Entry Form

The 2019 Bake Day Contest will be held November 16, 2019 at 4-H Field Day, at the Sale Barn at the Kern County Fair Grounds in Bakersfield.

Check-in for entries will be from 8-8:45 a.m.

Bake Day Rules:

- MEMBERS CAN ENTER UP TO TWO ENTRIES IN DIFFERENT CATEGORIES, including the "Whole Grains" category. Any 4-H member, 9 years and above may enter in the regular judging part of the contest; Cloverbuds may enter but only in the Cloverbud category. (Youth are enrolled based on their chronological age by December 31st of the current program year. So, members who will be age nine by December 31, 2020 are considered to be Junior members and are eligible to enter the judging contest. Junior members are 9-10 years of age, Intermediate members are 11-13, and Senior members are 14-19.)
- 2. All cakes should be place on a **non-returnable** carrier appropriate to the size of your entry.
- 3. Attach a removable identification label with **NAME, AGE** and **CATEGORY** to your entry. If a cake is covered with plastic wrap, please put the label on the outside.
- 4. Attach the recipe or a list of ingredients, for all baked entries. Packaged mixes are acceptable, with the exception of the "Whole Wheat" category. (Example of a recipe mix card: Chocolate cake mix, added cherries.) You do not need to include the brand name.
- <u>NO entries will be transferred to another category.</u> Entries entered in the wrong category will be judged in the category entered but will be ineligible for awards. Late entries <u>will not be judged</u> for awards. Registration is from 8:00-8:45 a.m. the day of the event.
- 6. Decorated cakes <u>must be baked</u> by the member. The design should be applied by use of decorating tips or fondant. Some small purchased figures are permissible. Permanent portions of the decorated cake will be returned upon request immediately following the contest. <u>Originality is important!</u> Decorated cakes will be judged on outside appearance (30%), originality (20%), inside texture and moisture (20%), and workmanship and color combination (30%).
- The "Chocolate", "White", or "Other Flavors" categories may be a sheet or layered cakes. These designations refer to the flavor of the cake only. Frosting may be any flavor.
- 8. For safety reasons, **NO** cream pies or frostings and fillings made with whipping cream, sour cream or other cream products will be accepted. If the entry requires refrigeration, it will **NOT** be accepted, so please make wise selections!
- 9. Whole Grains: Members entering the "Whole Grains" category are not limited regarding the type of item to make, with the exception of rule #8. <u>The "Whole Grains" item must be made from scratch</u>, with the ratio of flours or grains used being no less than 75% whole grains. Suggestions for this category include; but are not limited to, the use of whole wheat flour, potato, rye, and rolled oats. The use of white flour in this category must not exceed 25% of the total grains used.



Insurance and the 4-H Volunteer

As we begin a new 4-H program year, it is important that 4-H volunteer leaders understand the different types of insurance regarding the University of California (UC) Agriculture and Natural Resources (ANR) Department and the 4-H program. The areas of insurance regarding the 4-H program that we often receive questions about include accident, liability, driving and property.

Accident

4-H members and adult volunteers are provided limited accident coverage from the Hartford Insurance Company when taking part in or attending an approved, regularly supervised 4-H activity. They are also covered while traveling to and from a 4-H club or county activity, and while traveling directly between home and a 4-H meeting place for a scheduled activity. However, in the event of an auto accident and there is other medical payments coverage available, the Hartford Policy will not provide coverage until the other insurance is exhausted. General Liability

Volunteers acting within the course and scope of their volunteer duties are protected by UC's general liability insurance program in the event of a claim or lawsuit against the volunteer and/or UC. This coverage does not relate to injuries to the volunteer or the volunteer's property, but covers the volunteer's liability for the supervision of people and general supervision of ANR sponsored programmatic activity. There are some exceptions and limitations, which are determined on a case-by-case basis through investigation. Vehicle Usage as a Volunteer

The University insurance program provides secondary automobile liability coverage while driving during the course and scope of official ANR business activities. An individual's personal automobile insurance is primary. For secondary coverage, volunteers must maintain primary liability insurance as required under University policy. Currently, primary liability coverage of \$50,000 per accident claim, \$100,000 in aggregate, and \$50,000 for property damage should be maintained to qualify for secondary coverage by the University. If the vehicle driven by the volunteer is involved in an accident, secondary coverage applies. This secondary accident coverage is provided only after the limits of the vehicles' primary liability insurance policy have been reached.

Personal Property Insurance

The insurance program does not provide coverage for any personal or real property not within the University's care, custody and control. As an example, no coverage is provided for ownership of and use of an animal in a project. Additionally, no property-related liability coverage is provided while using one's home, ranch, garden or arena for a program activity. Volunteers should check with their insurance carriers and review their personal insurance coverage before assuming the risks involved in using their personal property for ANR programs.

Small-scale/ Backyard Livestock and Poultry Survey

Alda Pires is a researcher at UC Davis whose work focuses on food safety and small-scale poultry and livestock production. In 2018, in conjunction with the California Department of Food and Agriculture, she conducted a series of educational workshops covering topics related to backyard poultry and livestock production and food safety. As a follow-up to those workshops, she is distributing a survey to gain a better understanding of healthrelated concerns and antimicrobial use (antibiotics) in small-scale herds and flocks. The information provided will be used to guide future research and outreach to better serve small-scale livestock and poultry producers. She is hoping to get information from 4-H families as well.

The survey is now open to all owners and small-scale producers of livestock and poultry in California regardless of workshop attendance. The survey takes about 20 minutes and can be accessed at:
