Mitigation Pathways for conifer encroachment in California woodlands



Encroachment with merchantable conifers (>12" dbh)

Oak basal area >35 ft² per acre

Special Prescription

- ✓ Removed conifers must be within 300' of living oak
- ✓ No size constraints on removed conifers
- ✓ Requires an RPF to prepare
- $\checkmark\,$ Can amend into NTMP
- ✓ No limit on project size
- ✓ Allowed on steeper ground and where in lieu practices are needed
- All THP requirements apply (wildlife, botany, archeological, etc.)
- ✓ Requires post-harvest conifer stocking be <50% of total onsite stocking
- ✓ Oak may be included in postproject stocking requirements

Oak basal area <35 ft² per acre

Exemption (THP)

- ✓ Removed conifers must be within 300' of living oak
- ✓ Removed conifers must ≤26" diameter at 8" stump height
- ✓ Requires an RPF to prepare
- ✓ Allowed within existing NTMP
- ✓ Limited to 300 acres/5 years/
- planning watershed/ ownership X Not allowed in a WLPZ
- ✓ Requires slash treatment
- ✓ Requires confidential archeological letter
- ✓ Requires post-harvest conifer stocking be <25% of total onsite stocking
- X Not allowed in So. Sub-Dist. of the Coast Dist. or the So. Dist.

Forest conversion

- ✓ Re-establish dominant conifer forest

Non-commercial conifer encroachment assistance funding sources

NRCS- <u>EQIP</u>

- ✓ Livestock and small forestry operators or leasees
- ✓ Funded activities include: management planning, stand and range improvement activities, and slash management
- ✓ <u>Maintenance-</u> landowner required to maintain conditions for 10 years
- ✓ <u>Prescribed fire</u>- funded only with approved burn plan
- Reimbursements are made after the projects are completed and an NRCS specialist verifies work meets agreed upon standards

NRCS-<u>RCPP</u>

- ✓ Livestock and small forestry operators or leasees
- Funding specifically intended for oak conservation projects. Priority given to projects in Mendocino County (South Fork Eel River, Russian River, Outlet Creek, and Navarro River watersheds);
 Humboldt County (Middle Van Duzen, Mattole River, and Middle Mad River watershed); and Trinity County (South Fork Trinity, Upper Mad River, and Upper Van Duzen watersheds)
- \checkmark All terms are the same as EQIP

US FWS- Partners Program

- ✓ Landowners, tribes, NGOs for habitat restoration activities
- ✓ Funded activities include: oak restoration, stream restoration, wetland enhancement, off-site watering, and riparian improvement
- ✓ <u>Maintenance-</u> Landowners retain the habitat improvements for 10 years
- ✓ <u>Prescribed fire</u>- Currently developing a prescribed fire policy at the national level
- ✓ Reimbursements are made after the projects are completed and FWS verifies work meets agreed upon standards

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CAL FIRE- CFIP

- ✓ Private and public ownerships from 20 to 5,000 acres of forestland
- ✓ Funded activities include: management planning, site preparation, tree planting, timber stand improvement, fish and wildlife habitat improvement
- ✓ <u>Maintenance-</u> landowner required to maintain conditions for 10 years. CFIP will fund continued mechanical treatment of encroachment
- ✓ <u>Prescribed fire</u>- see VMP below
- ✓ Reimbursements are made after the projects are completed and CAL FIRE verifies work meets agreed upon standards

CAL FIRE- <u>VMP</u>

- \checkmark Same landowners as above
- ✓ The program supports prescribed burning and pile burning
