

Attention Livestock Project Leaders and Members...in consideration of the "Shelter in Place" order that is currently in effect due to the Coronavirus, there are some changes being made to the Livestock Achievement Program for this year. Because all in person 4-H activities and meetings are currently restricted through April 30th, the written tests will be postponed until possibly the month of May. **Unfortunately 4-H Fair at Reedley College on Saturday, May 9th** has been canceled due to campus closure. Leaders, please contact Susanne Carroll (susanneandkevin@yahoo.com or (559) 269-9959) to reserve tests for your members. Upon the re-opening of the 4-H Office, we plan to distribute written tests at that time. Parents, if your child's leader is not participating in the program, please contact Susanne to reserve a test for your child. Remember...members can only test in one level per species and must begin with Level 1. Members who completed Level 1, 2, 3, or 4 testing in their species last year can move on to the next level, whether or not they received a gold medal. We are currently working on an alternate plan for the skills portion testing. All members who tested but did not receive a gold medal do, however, have the option to repeat that level this year. Written test scores will be combined with skills tests and members will receive a gold medal or a blue, red, or white ribbon.


California 4-H State Field Day is GOING VIRTUAL

California 4-H State Field Day May 18-31, 2020 Times Vary Virtual Format

April 1, 2020: The State Field Day planning team monitored information regarding COVID-19 from the California Department of Public Health and the Center for Disease Control and Prevention. The UC Davis campus canceled all events on-campus through spring quarter. Our priority is ensuring the safety of the young people in the 4-H program, their families, and our community.

Therefore, we decided to move to a virtual format for State 4-H Field Day 2020. State 4-H Field Day will NOT be hosted on May 30 at UC Davis.

2020 Adventure Risk Challenge Summer Courses

Still a Go as of April 1st- Updates Pending

Adventure Risk Challenge offers exciting opportunities for motivated high school youth who want a bright future. Your adventure may begin in Yosemite National Park, in the mountains of Tahoe, or in the tall forests of Sequoia and Kings Canyon National Parks. You will backpack and go on other outdoor adventures, read, write, improve your academic skills, learn about the environment, and work as a team. ARC summer courses are designed for students who are excited to learn and excited to be in the outdoors.

After submitting the application, students from Tahoe/Truckee, Reno, and the Central Valley will be invited to an orientation weekend in April or May, during which interviews will take place and final students will be accepted into the summer courses. If you are a student applying from another region, an orientation may be available in your area and ARC staff will contact you with more information. If you are admitted to the program, ARC staff will determine which of ARC's three sites (Yosemite, Tahoe, or Sequoia/Kings Canyon) will best suit your interests and needs.



ARC Yosemite National Park – June 22 – July 25
 Come explore Yosemite National Park's natural beauty, its waterfalls, its alpine lakes, and its spectacular granite cliffs! Yosemite is one of our country's premier national parks.

ARC Tahoe – June 29 – August 1
 The Sierra Nevada mountain range around Lake Tahoe will be home to students in the ARC Tahoe course.
 You will see breathtaking mountain lakes and waterfalls. Come experience life in the mountains!

 ARC Sequoia & Kings Canyon National Parks – June 22 - July 18 Sequoia's backcountry offers a vast expanse of high-alpine wonders. You'll enjoy gorgeous views of granite domes, lush green meadows, and towering Sequoia trees—the largest trees in the world!
