# Why attract birds to your yard?

- Most species are declining as natural habitats disappear your yard can provide habitat connectivity
- Birds can assist with pollination and pest control

### What do birds need?

- Cover/Shelter
- Nesting
- Food and Water

#### **Unintended Consequences**

- Increase risks to birds from predators and window-strikes
- Undesirable critters attracted by bird feeders
- Bird damage to home orchards and tender seedlings
