November Coronavirus Updates on 4-H In-Person Meetings

Fresno County remains in the "Red" zone currently which allows for indoor meetings following the guidelines of 6" safe distancing at all times and not to exceed more than 25% max room capacity. The group allowance is currently up to 100 youth and 2 adults when meeting space can accommodate.

Best practice continues to be outdoors or remotely when possible. With numbers on the rise the health and safety of all members is our TOP PRIORITY. Members of same households should remain together when possible. Masks, hand washing, and sanitizer are required. To minimize risks do not share objects or supplies. Two mandatory training documents must be reviewed by Project/Club Leaders prior to holding meetings. Awareness of Coronavirus Disease and Mitigation Standards Summary COVID-19 Stage2. Leaders MUST complete the survey once documents have been read. Each club is being issued a laminated COVID-19 poster and a questionnaire that ALL meeting participants must answer. Anyone answering "Yes" to a health risk question will NOT be allowed to enter or participate in the meeting. Updated sign in logs have been added to our county website COVID-19 Resources page. CCLs are responsible to verify leader's completion of COVID-19 trainings. The list will be emailed out weekly.

You MUST Follow these meeting guideline Requirements:

- 1) If feeling ill, running a temperature, or recently exposed to COVID-19, STAY HOME!
- 2) Facility must accommodate 6" safe distance and no more than 25% of max capacity.
- 3) Must maintain six feet distance between people at all times (same households only exclusion)
- 4) Wear face coverings (cloth, paper, or bandanas, etc.) when six feet separation cannot be maintained.
- 5) Maintain sanitary practices –frequently clean and disinfect workspaces and equipment, wash hands often and use hand sanitizer.

- Assign activities project members can complete at home and submit completed work back to Project Leader (Baking Project – baking cookies, photography – share photos, etc.)
- Poster of livestock breeds/knowledge (Rabbit Project - sharing varieties of Rabbit breeds)
- Sharing videos of project aspects (Horse project - confirmation of a horse)

What is an Emerald Star?

Fresno County offers 4-H’ers the opportunity to earn an Emerald Star. The Emerald Star program is designed for intermediate and senior 4-H members ages 13 and up. The Emerald Star project's purpose includes:

1. Providing an opportunity for 4-H members to develop projects in their community or in 4-H beyond the club level.
2. Improving, creating, and expanding 4-H programs.

Helping individual 4-H members grow and improve in the areas of organization, leadership, and project planning.

This program is designed to help youth learn about project planning, organization, and presentation. Typically, youth develop an action plan for some type of multi-county event. They then organize and facilitate this event. After completion and presentation of their project, they are awarded with the Emerald Star ranking. GIRLS HEALTH PROJECT – LONE STAR 4-H – OPEN TO ALL CLUBS

Periods. We're talking about periods! Join us virtually at your art table & in your kitchen as we explore a girl's monthly cycle from a new perspective.

While often shrouded in a cloud of mystery & even shame, we'll be going "behind the scenes" to look at this 5th vital sign. Yup, vital sign! Back in 2015 the ACOG (American College of Obstetricians & Gynecologists) decreed that a girl's cycle is her 5th vital sign & indicator of health.

In this project we'll spend some time exploring the different phases of a cycle & how it plays into a girl's everyday health - in the way she feels, eats, exercises, & thinks. These incredible hormones really do impact so many aspects of our lives!

This program is not geared towards sex education but only body literacy as it pertains to female hormones & this 5th vital sign. There's a lot of taboo around this topic & it can be uncomfortable for some. But we're going to take that head on & address it together with sensitivity because this information is pertinent to healthy living.

We'll have 5 virtual meetings that will include art-making & time in the kitchen connected to our topic. The kitchen portion will be optional as we prepare & enjoy foods that support different cycle phases. Since this is all virtual, you'll be provided with a shopping list well in advance.

There is no age requirement for this class because the information is pertinent to girls whether they have started cycling or not, though younger girls will likely need assistance in the kitchen. Parents are always welcome to attend & participate in our meetings.

Project meetings will take place on Sunday afternoons from 2-3:30 on the following dates: October 18, November 15, January 24, February 21, & March 21.

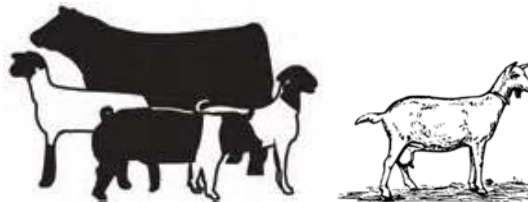
