Home Hardening and Defensible Space Workshops

- Type vegetation to plant and how far it should be from the home
- Fire-safe vents
- Clearing vegetation from roofs and gutters

Defensible Space Work Party

- Clearing leaves and other vegetation from ground
- Limbing trees
- Making burn piles

Pile Burn Workshops

Last .

Fire Lighter Trainings

- Required prior to participating in a prescribed burn (unless you already have experience)
- Learn how to use prescribed burning tools like drip torches, fire hoses, water pumps, fire shelters
- Learn a variety of other skills needed to participate in a burn

- Grassland burn
- Primary goal was training
- Secondary goal to improve coastal prairie habitat

Second Prescribed Burn – Santa Lucia Preserve, November 7, 2021



- Goals 1) training and 2) kill coyote brush that is invading coastal prairie grassland
- Research plots to see how chain sawing, masticating, and crushing coyote brush before burning influences how well the burn can kill the plant
- Analyzing results now

Researchers, legislators, and reporters have attended our burns.

Received second CAL FIRE grant starting in January 2022

- Increase burn coordinator to full time
 - More outreach and site visits
- Hire a part-time assistant to help with outreach, including in Spanish
- Develop apprenticeship program for tribal members
- Conduct 4 more prescribed burns
- Coordinate a CalTREX
- Write 10 burn plans for private ranchers
- Conduct more workshops
- Purchase a 525 gallon water trailer and some PPE
