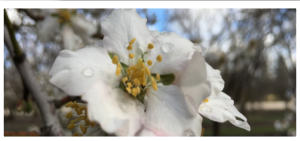

Considerations in management of vegetable crops viruses

Weed control considerations for 2022

The 2021/2022 rainy season started with early and significant rain in November throughout the state. Weed germination is well underway and now is a perfect time to apply winter pre-emergent herbicides ahead of a rain event and before weeds get too large.



Phosphorus: Does your orchard need it?

Phosphorus fertilization is only needed if your trees are below the July sufficiency ranges, and documented deficiencies in orchard and vineyard crops in California is extremely rare. There may be some benefit to providing phosphorus to young trees, however evidence to date does not show mature orchards need it.
