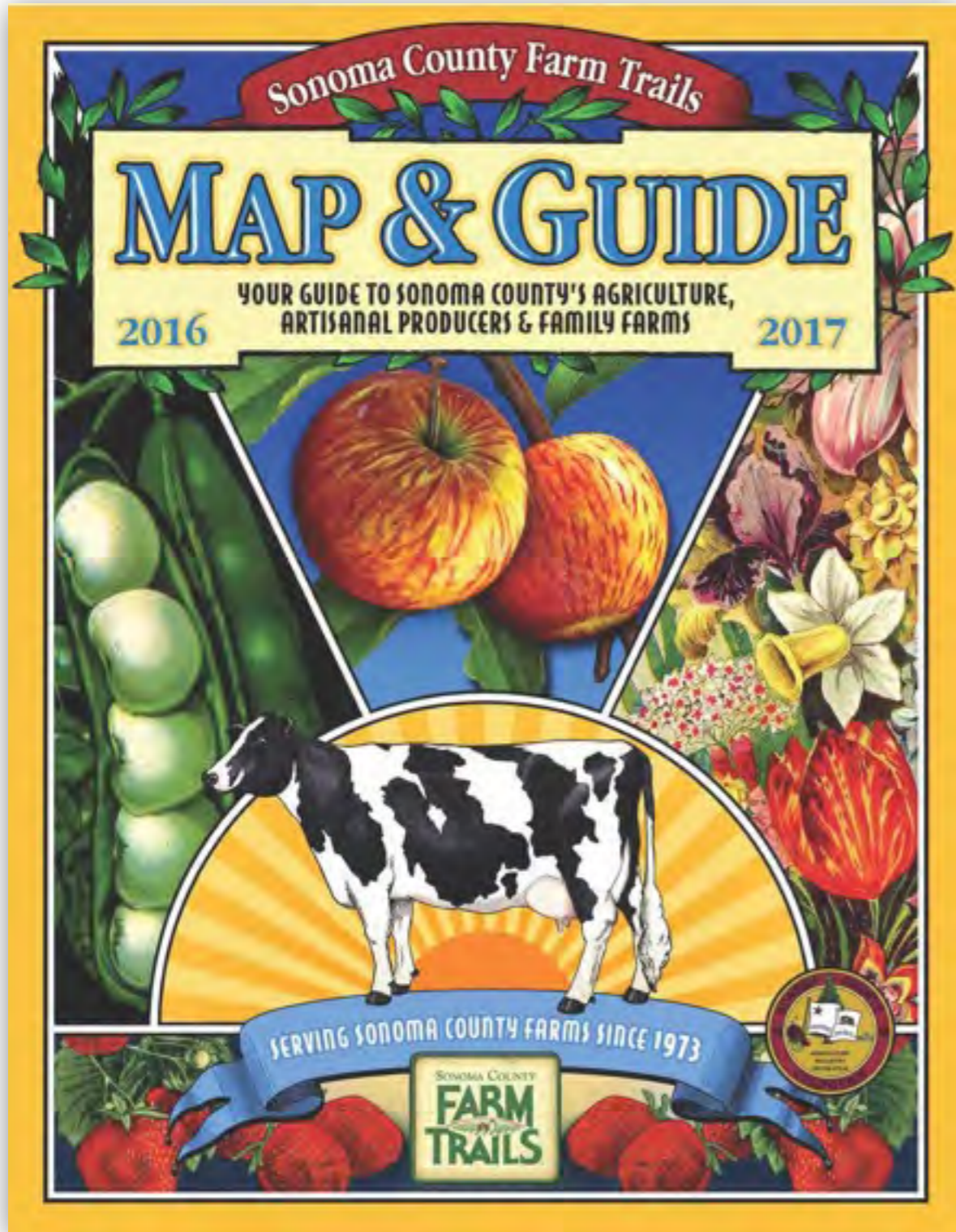

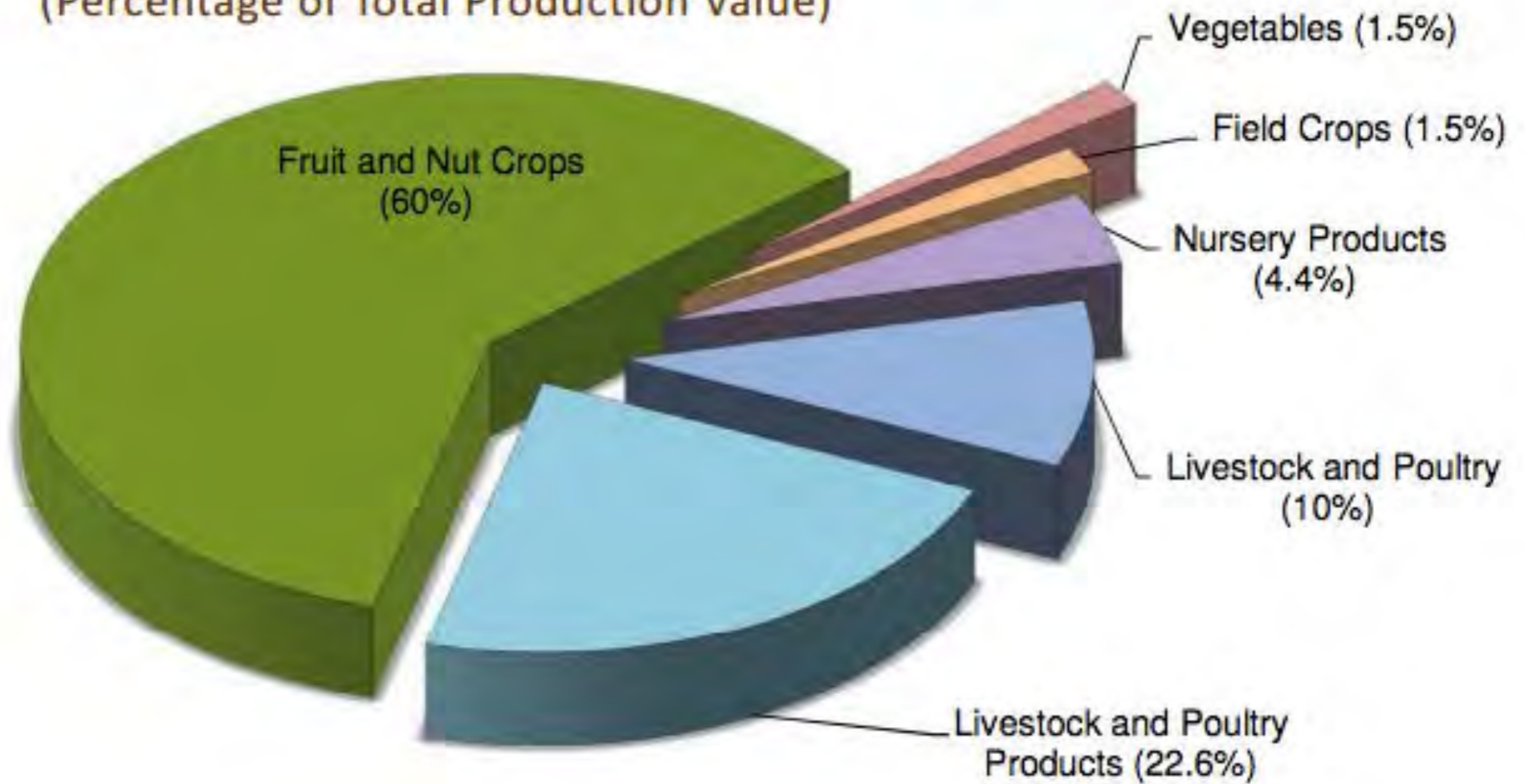

Estimated Total Driving Time: 1 Hour
Miles Between Destinations: 4 - 8 miles

This suggested Southern loop is jam-packed & kid-friendly! Special tours, cow milking demos, & activities are available (\$5-\$15). At Live Oak Farm enjoy seasonal bounty & learn about their goal for a sustainable community. In downtown Petaluma, sample sweet & savory pies at Petaluma Pie Co. And last but not least, at Tara Firma Farms, families can tour the grounds, once overseen by famed author & farmer Joel Salatin, and meet baby chicks that will fit in the palm of your hand.

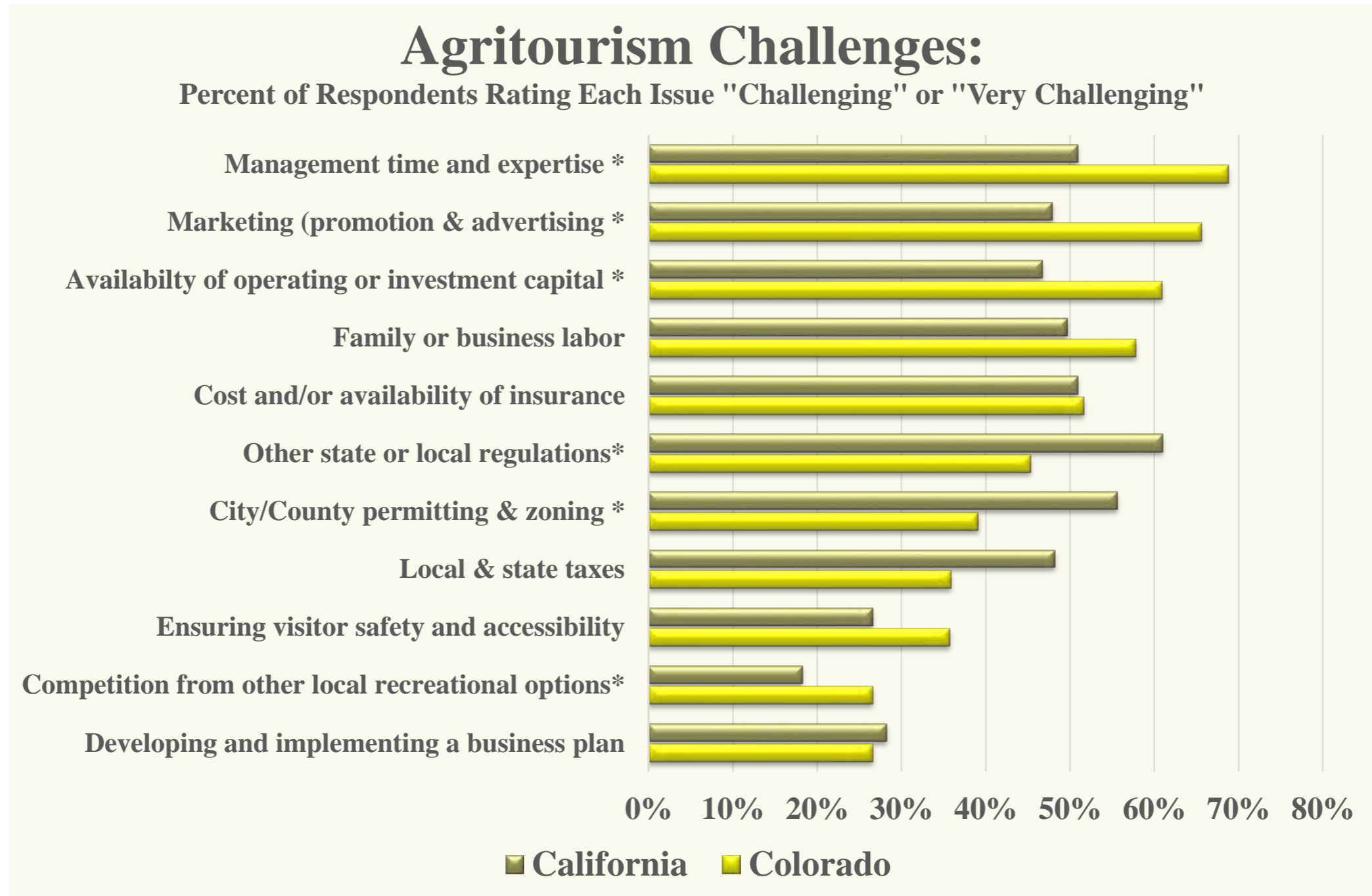

“Influences Affecting Agritourism Success in the Western US”

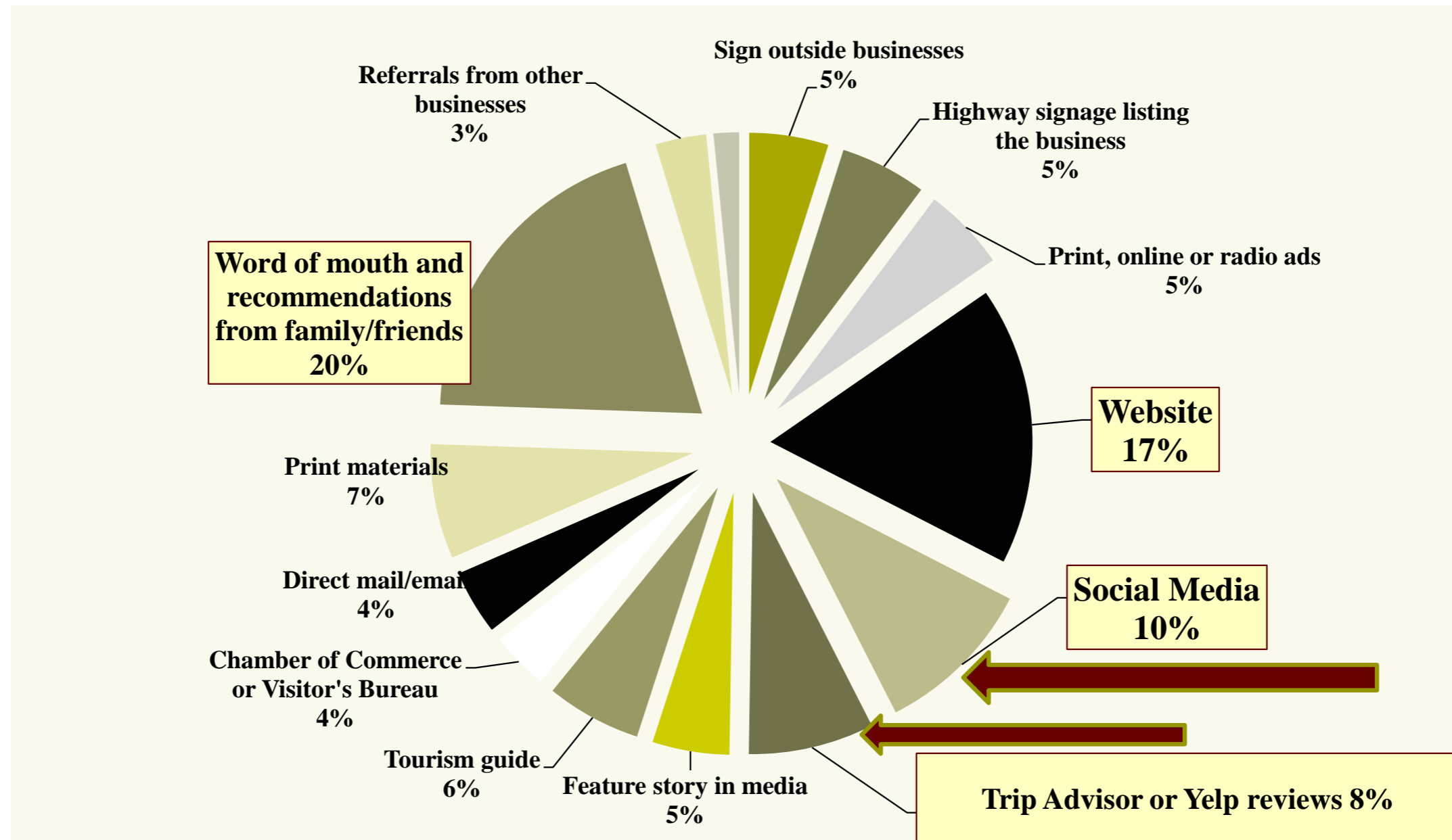
