\$63 million available for conservation practices on farms and ranches in California



Looking for technical or financial assistance to implement conservation practices in your field?

Your local Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) staff can help with their financial incentives programs like EQIP and CSP.

The Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) provides financial assistance to agricultural producers to address natural resource concerns and deliver environmental benefits.

The Conservation Stewardship Program, or CSP, pays producers for actively managing, maintaining, and expanding conservation activities integrated within their agricultural operations.

NRCS also offers conservation technical assistance at no cost to give producers personalized advice and information, to help them make informed decisions.
