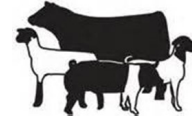


Livestock Achievement Day

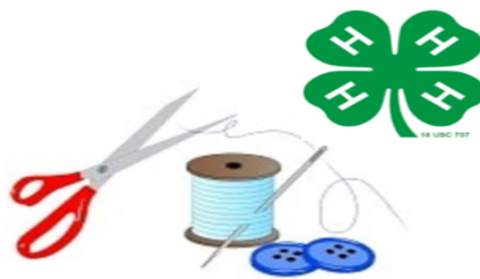
