- Organization Show preparation and show participation.
- Communication Comprehension of show rules and schedule. Verbal and nonverbal communication with livestock judges.
- Confidence Every minute spent in the ring builds confidence for the next time the youth enter the ring.

GENERAL RULES:

- 1. Primary 4-H members, 5-8 years old, may show only in the PRIMARY CLASSES and the PET PARADE ONLY.
- 2. **BEFORE ARRIVING AT EVENT:** Rabbits must be tattooed in the left ear. Cavy must be tattooed or tagged in the left ear. Poultry must be leg-banded for identification.
- 3. ALL SHOWMANSHIP classes are restricted to one (1) animal entered. See division rules for entry limits in ALL OTHER CLASSES. If more than one animal is entered in breeding or conformation classes, other current 4-H members, 9 years and up, may assist by showing the extra animal.
- 4. All animals entered must be currently owned and cared for by 4-H member under the direct supervision of a certified 4-H leader. <u>Therefore</u> 4-H members may only participate in the showmanship classes with animals under their ownership and care.
- 5. All Division rules must be followed, or entries will not be accepted for judging.
- 6. DO NOT bring any bedding. Be sure to bring a container to water your animal.
- 7. Rabbits and Cavies MUST BE in waterproof carrying cages.
- 8. Be sure to bring a shovel, rake, and broom to clean up your area.
- 9. The 4-H member is responsible for meeting check-in and judging times. Exhibitors must be ready when classes are called. Late exhibits will not be judged.

JUDGING/AWARDS:

- Only classes in the premium book will be judged NO CLASSES ARE TO BE ADDED.
- Long pants and appropriate footwear (closed toed shoes or boots) are required when exhibiting animals. Sleeveless shirts and bare midriffs are not appropriate. 4-H members may wear the 4-H uniform, but it is not required for participation. It is not a criterion in judging.
- Long sleeved shirts are required in all rabbit and cavy showmanship classes.
- SHOWMANSHIP and CONFORMATION CLASSES in the RABBIT AND CAVY divisions run simultaneously.
- SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES DO NOT ADVANCE participants to upper age division classes; Juniors do not advance to Intermediate and so on.

- Junior, Intermediate and Senior 4-H Members' entries will be evaluated with the American Evaluation System as well as with the Danish Evaluation system, dependent on what division class is entered.
- Primary members will not be evaluated and are not eligible for awards. All primary members will receive a ribbon for their participation.
- All Showmanship classes will be evaluated with the American Evaluation System. Each division (Junior, Intermediate, & Senior), in each class, will award one top individual with a hat pin and blue ribbon. Second high individual will receive a red ribbon. Third high individual will receive a white ribbon.
- All Poultry Breeding, Rabbit Confirmation, Pygmy Goat Conformation, and Cavy Conformation classes will
 be evaluated with the American Evaluation System. Each class will award one top individual with a
 blue ribbon. Second high individual will receive a red ribbon. Third high individual will receive a white
 ribbon.
- All Dog Obedience classes will be evaluated with the Danish Evaluation System. Each class will award a blue, red or white ribbon to each entrant based on evaluation.
- Pins will be awarded to the Top Conformation (Rabbit, Cavy, Pygmy Goat), Breeding (Poultry), and Obedience (Dog).
- Judges' decisions are final. Respect should be given to those recruited as judges. All judges are volunteers and offer their expertise in evaluating 4-H project animals.

DIVISION A: Pet Parade

- 1. All Fur and Feathers 4-H Fair participants are welcome
- 2. No judging Participation Awards ONLY
- 3. Limited to animals from Divisions A E
- You must always be able to contain your animal at all times. You may carry or use a small wagon, cart or cage.
- 5. Parade will take place at the beginning of the event.

Class 1: Pet Parade -

4-H members are encouraged to dress up their animals and/or themselves, but it's not mandatory. This is a fun and special opportunity for members to showcase their favorite animal.

DIVISION B: Rabbits

- 1. Primary 4-H members, (5-8 years old), may ONLY show in CLASS 4
- 2. Limit of two (2) heavyweight and (2) lightweight entries TOTAL
- 3. Limit of one (1) entry per Showmanship classes.
- 4. Conformation classes all breeds and all sexes shown together
- 5. Long sleeved shirts required for Showmanship classes.
- 6. Showmanship and Conformation classes run simultaneously.
- 7. BEFORE EVENT: All rabbits must be tattooed in their left ear.

- 1. Primary 4-H members, (5-8 years old), may ONLY show in CLASS 2
- 2. Limit of two (2) entries per Conformation classes.
- 3. Limit of one (1) entry per Showmanship classes.
- 4. Conformation classes all breeds and all sexes shown together
- 5. Long sleeved shirts required for Showmanship classes.
- 6. Showmanship and Conformation classes run simultaneously.
- 7. **BEFORE EVENT:** All cavies must be tattooed or tagged in their left ear.

Primary 4-H members, (5-8 years old), may ONLY show in CLASS 3

3. Limit of one (1) entry per Showmanship classes.

4. BEFORE EVENT: All poultry must be leg-banded for identification.

DIVISION E: Pygmy Goat

1. Primary 4-H members, (5-8 years old), may ONLY show in CLASS 3 2.

Limit of two (2) entries per Conformation classes.

DIVISION F: DOG

- 1. Primary 4-H members, (5-8 years old), may ONLY show in CLASSES 4 and 5 or 6.
- 2. Limit of two (2) entries per Obedience classes.
- 3. Limit of one (1) entry per Showmanship classes.
- 4. **Primary Obedience A:** For the first-year exhibitor (5-8 years old) with a dog they have just started to train. Exercises performed on a six-foot leash are heeling, sit, down, stand, and call-to-front. Treats are allowed

- 5. **Primary Obedience B:** Exhibitor (5-8 years old) Exercises performed on six-foot leash are heeling, figure 8, recall, stand for examination, long sit (1 minute) and long down (3 minutes).
- 6. **Beginning Obedience A:** For the first-year exhibitor with a dog they have just started to train. Exercises performed on a six-foot leash are heeling, sit, down, stand, and call-to-front. Treats are allowed
- 7. **Beginning Obedience B:** For the exhibitor and their dog who have had one or more years of training and have won less than three first place ribbons in any other obedience competitions. Exercises performed on a six-foot leash are heeling, figure 8, stand for examination, recall, long sit (1 minute) and long down (3 minutes)
- 8. **Novice Obedience**: Dog may have received any number of years of training. Exhibitor and dog have won three first place ribbons in Beginning Obedience at any other obedience competition. Exercises performed on a six-foot leash are heeling and figure 8. Exercises performed off leash are heeling, recall, stand for examination, long sit (1 minute) and long down (3 minutes).
- 9. Graduate Novice Obedience: Dog may have received any number of years of training. Exhibitor and dog have won three first place ribbons in any Novice Obedience competition. Exhibitor and dog may compete in this class until their project leader feels they are ready for the next class, which is Open Obedience. Exercises performed on six-foot leash are heeling. Exercises performed off leash are heeling, figure 8, drop on recall, and stand for examination. Long sit (3 minutes) and long down (5 minutes) performed with handler out of sight.
- 10. **Open Obedience:** Dogs may have received any number of years of training. Exhibitor and dog have competed in Graduate Novice Obedience and their leader feels they are ready to compete in Open Obedience. Exercises performed off leash are heeling, figure 8, drop on recall, retrieve on flat, and retrieve over high jump. Broad jump, long sit (3 minutes), and long down (5 minutes) performed with handler out of sight.
