**What's involved?** Evaluating aesthetic qualities of selected plants (takes ~60-90 mins)

**About the event:** Participants are asked to assess the impact of different levels of irrigation on landscape plant performance. After a short introduction to the rubric, participants will evaluate the aesthetic qualities of selected plants independently at their own pace. We will provide a clipboard, ratings sheet, and pen. Sturdy, comfortable shoes, sunscreen and/or a hat are suggested since fields are uneven mulch/packed dirt in full or partial sun. Carpooling is encouraged but not required. Cold water will be provided.

**About the Project:** UC LPIT™ seeks to improve urban water-use efficiency by evaluating landscape plant performance on three irrigation treatments corresponding to the Water Use Classification of Landscape Species (WUCOLS) High, Moderate, and Low categories of water need.
