The Ag Burn Alternatives Grant Program provides incentives to utilize an alternative practice for the disposition of agricultural material from orchard/vineyard removals as an alternative to open burning. In addition, the program provides incentives for the purchase of new agricultural wood-chipping equipment to chip orchard and vineyard removals located within the San Joaquin Valley. Complete applications are processed on a first-come, first-served basis while funds are available.




Grant Opportunities: CDFW Wolf Livestock Compensation Grants

"CDFW is now accepting applications for direct livestock loss compensation (Prong 1) as part of the Wolf-Livestock Compensation Program. Eligible applicants can submit a completed Livestock Loss Application form, found on the Department's Wolf Livestock Compensation Grant's page. Eligible applicants include livestock producers who have had "confirmed" or "probable" wolf depredations after July 1, 2024, as determined through an official investigation and documented by CDFW on a Livestock Loss Determination Form.

Due to the limited funds available to support the Wolf Livestock Compensation Program, CDFW is prioritizing direct loss compensation, at this time, and is not seeking applications for non-lethal deterrents (Prong 2) or pay for presence (Prong 3).

News Updates: California Guidance on Bird Flu for Workers & Employers

"The California Department of Health has recently released a document that addresses the most common questions and concerns regarding the H5N1 bird flu in dairy, poultry, and worker safety.

The most significant aspect of this document is that there have been no reported deaths in human cases. The symptoms have remained mild, the most common being an eye infection, and zero hospitalizations." -Kern County FB

News Updates: Biden, Newsom Officials Announce New Water Delivery Rules

"California introduced new rules for its key water systems to balance the needs of cities, farms, and the environment.

Urban areas and some farms will receive more water, while others, particularly in the San Joaquin Valley, will face reductions by almost 20% in dry years, with slighter cuts in wetter years.

The state water board will soon vote on a plan to either increase Delta water flow requirements or have water users restore fish habitats through voluntary agreements." - Kern County Farm Bureau

News Updates: State Water Project Allocation Increases Following Recent Storms in Northern California

"The California Department of Water Resources (DWR) has raised the 2025 State Water Project allocation to 15% of requested water, up from 5%, due to recent storms that increased rainfall and reservoir levels. These storms came after a dry start to the water year.

DWR emphasizes the importance of this update for planning but warns that dry conditions in Southern California and unpredictable weather could still affect water supplies. The State Water Project serves 27 million Californians, and water forecasts will be updated monthly, with the next update expected sometime this month."
